From the Mayor's Desk



I am truly humbled and very much energized to be the next Mayor of Lemont. Along with the members of the board, together we are very much looking forward to serving the great people of this great town. Each member of the Village Board brings a unique skillset and perspective that will be very helpful in addressing the needs and issues of our Village. I look forward to working with each one of them, and together we look forward to serving, meeting, and hopefully exceeding the expectations of all residents. We are all here to serve you.

As your Village leaders, our goal is to provide an environment with the best possible services in the most economical and efficient manner possible. By providing such a robust environment, ultimately as a result, one of our main goals is for all home and property values to increase in value.

Each member of the board has had opportunities to meet with residents who have expressed and discussed their thoughts with us. It is through this process that our vision of specific areas of opportunity emerged, which we are very excited to share with you.

As many of you have shared with the Village Board, our biggest area of opportunity as a village is to address our economic development, empty store fronts and to grow our business base. To do this we will need to reallocate some of our limited resources and address this issue from many different angles.

Over the past several months, I have shared and discussed a dedicated economic development plan with many of you. With concurrence of the Village Board, we now ask for your input and ideas regarding the following ten-point plan:

- 1. Village Hall and elected officials will proactively partner with our business community.
- 2. Allocate dedicated resources to business and planning development. This includes the hiring of a Community Development Director and a dedicated position to work exclusively with current and future business owners.
- 3. Support and assist in creating newly formed merchant committees and groups.
- 4. Stop business leakage and increase overall marketing efforts to encourage village commerce. Let's keep Lemont businesses in Lemont.
- 5. Create a new business recruitment and a new business mentoring program. Research and find what businesses are lacking or missing in Lemont.
- 6. Strategically plan and support new business and activities that utilize our location and unique natural assets to further promote Lemont as a travel destination.
- 7. Partner with landlords and building owners. We will need to work with the building owners to better understand their long-term plans and rental rates, along with assisting them with potential new tenants. Assist in creating multi-use commercial and residential buildings to be more competitive from a property tax standpoint.
- 8. Streamline business build-outs. Determine what hurdles we can lower or eliminate.
- 9. Streamline new-home permitting, including all housing remodel permitting. Increased infrastructure in Lemont will increase everyone's property values. In addition, strategic housing growth will help support and grow our business commerce.
- 10. Prioritize current Tax Increment Finance's (TIF) and evaluate future TIF opportunities based on return on investment. Review opportunities for new business grants/tax incentives.

The bottom line is that we need to streamline and be as efficient as possible in order to grow our property values and increase our business base while maintaining the proper adherence to our building standards. This economic development focus will obviously be in addition to providing the expected high quality services in a safe and clean environment.

Along with a dedicated plan on economic development, we will continually strive to make improvements to our customer service with residents. In addition, other opportunities of focus will be resolving our current legal lawsuits and annexation disputes.

Obtaining your input is extremely important to us. I have all of the confidence in our Village Board of Trustees, and together we will have a great four-year run in making Lemont a community to be even prouder to call home.



SEASONAL REMINDERS



BOAT, CAMPER, TRAILER STORAGE / PARKING

Village ordinance requires that boats, campers or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper, or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2704.

ODD-EVEN WATERING REGULATIONS IN EFFECT

Properties with an odd number address may water on odd-numbered calendar days. Properties with an even numbered address may water on even numbered calendar days. Furthermore, no lawn sprinkling is allowed from the Village water system between the hours of 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. Odd-even regulations apply until October 1. On the day new sod is laid, residents may water freely (no permit required). Thereafter, the odd-even regulations apply.

SWIMMING POOLS

Swimming pools 24" and higher require a building permit and a 5' protective barrier. Call (630) 257-1580 for more information.

LAWN SPRINKLER AND COMMERCIAL RPZ VALVE CERTIFICATION

The Village of Lemont has contracted with Backflow Solutions, Inc. (BSI) to administer our cross-connection control/backflow tracking program. The Village will be utilizing BSI Online for all test report submittals.

All annual backflow assembly test reports must be

submitted electronically via the BSI Online system at www.bsionlinetracking.com by the testing company. Please note there is a filing fee of \$12.95 per test report submitted.

Each resident who owns a backflow assembly (RPZ valve) will be sent a notification letter from BSI with a Customer Confirmation Number (CCN). This number must be given to the tester in order for the reports to be properly filed with BSI.

Any residents wishing to permanently disconnect their lawn sprinkling system must contact the Village of Lemont Building Department at (630) 257-1580.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT

The Public Works Department manages the Village's mosquito abatement program. Residential spraying will be limited only to periods of excessive annoyance and storm drains will be treated regularly. Advance notice before spraying will be given upon request: (630) 257-2532. Sign up to receive notification via "Stay Informed" — Public Works Notifications.

How Can You Help?

- Promptly remove standing water from all pots, containers, and tire swings around the yard. Mosquitoes can develop in only five days.
- Keep weeds and grass mowed.
- Keep gutters free of leaves and debris so water runs freely.
- Change the water in bird baths once a week.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs regularly.
- Drain water from pool covers.



2016 WATER QUALITY REPORT

Our 2016 Water Quality Report in Lemont has met all the USEPA drinking water requirements and standards. Each year, the Village of Lemont provides its customers with an Annual Water Quality Report to let them know how our water quality stacks up against established Federal and State drinking water standards. LEMONT POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFERS DAT CLASSES

The growing problem of heroin continues to ruin people's lives. The Lemont Police Department has a Drug, Alcohol and Tobacco awareness program that is open to teens and young adults. This DAT program educates young people about the dangers of chemicals and the affects they have on your body, life and loved ones.

Knowledge is Power - Teenagers and young adults can be exposed to and tempted to try chemical substances in today's world. Provide them with the knowledge of the dangers of heroin, heroin substitutes, street drugs, prescription drugs, alcohol, tobacco and the wide variety of chemical dangers they may come in contact with by enrolling them in the DAT program.

The DAT program is for young adults, ages 12-21. Parents, guardians or grandparents can register those ages 12-17 and anyone ages 18-21 may register themselves. Classes run 1 ½ hours for two nights, Monday and Wednesday, and start promptly at 5:00 p.m. and finish at 6:30 p.m. Cost of the two-night class is \$50.00, payable the first night by cash or money order.

DAT evening classes are held year-round, typically the last Monday and Wednesday of each month.

AT YOUR DOOR SPECIAL COLLECTION SERVICE

The Village of Lemont, through Waste Management, has implemented the At Your Door Special Collection service. This service was implemented as a solution to the ever-increasing inquiries from residents about where to dispose of recyclable and hazardous waste items. A resident survey resulted in an overwhelming acceptance of such a program. The At Your Door Service is available to single and multi-family homes that are covered under our current Waste Management agreement. The monthly fee of \$1.25 will be added to residents quarterly Waste Management invoice; this is not an opt-out service.

Through this program, you can schedule a collection of these materials right from your home. Acceptable materials for pickup include:

- Automotive Products (used motor oil, oil filters and batteries)
- Garden Chemicals (pesticides, herbicides, weed killers, etc.)
- Paint Products
- Household Cleaners
- Swimming Pool Chemicals
- Electronics (TV's, computers, monitors and more)
- Household Batteries
- Fluorescent tubes and Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFL)
- Thermometers and thermostats

The Village of Lemont utilizes many different forms of communication exchange with our residents. Below are a few ways to receive and report information.

Sign Up to Stay Informed

Stay Informed is our main form of communicating information to residents on news, events, changes and updates related to the Village by sending messages via email and/or mobile text. This allows us to get information to you in a timely manner. Topics range from emergency notifications, road closures, found dogs, safety issues, to events, Mayor, Board and Village Administrator notifications and more.

Sign up to receive messages:

- 1. Visit our website at www.lemont.il.us.
- 2. Click on "Stay Informed" on the feature bar across the bottom of the page.
- 3. Follow the instructions to sign up and check the information you want to receive and how you want to receive it via email and/or mobile text. Creating a login eliminates any potential spam.
- 4. Once signed up, you will receive a verification message(s) from CivicPlus, our webhost company, that you must respond to in order to start receiving messages.

Once signed up, you can sign in at any time to view previously sent messages, update your personal information and modify what information you receive.

Report a Concern

This is a non-emergency reporting and tracking tool that allows you to submit a concern from a list of items, i.e., pothole reporting, streetlight outage, vacant property concern, public safety issues, etc.

To report a concern, select it from the feature bar across the bottom of our website page. Click on "Login" at the box on the right. Either sign in or create an account. An anonymous login is also available. Once logged in you simply click on any topic related to your issue, complete the information and submit the form. This information is sent to the assigned department to address the issue. Please call 911 for any safety issue that needs to be addressed immediately.

Mobile App

Our mobile app allows you to have the tools you need right at your fingertips to access information 24/7. It's connected directly to our website, providing you with the most current information, making it easy for you to access services you need, when you need them. It is compatible with both iOS and Android mobile devices. Simply go to a mobile app store and search "Village of Lemont" to download.

- DIRECT FROM IDOT AND SUBJECT TO CHANGE: IL 83/171 Cal Sag Channel Bridge repair is scheduled to start July 5. IMPACT ON TRAVEL: The Bridge will maintain South bound traffic throughout the project. North bound traffic crossing the Cal Sag Channel at IL 83/171 will be detoured. SUGGESTIONS TO MOTORISTS: North bound traffic should expect delayed times in their travel due to detour. TRAFFIC ALERT: Traffic on Archer Ave. (IL 171) southbound should expect delays at intersection of 107th St. and IL 83-Calumet Sag Rd. due to the merger of detroured traffic. 
