

#### Tom Ballard Receives 2016 Senior Citizen of the Year Award

Lemont Emergency Management Agency (LEMA) Director, Tom Ballard, was nominated and chosen for the 2016 Senior Citizen of the Year Award from Congressman Dan Lipinski. Tom has been with the Village of Lemont since 1999. Whenever there is an emergency situation that requires assistance, you can be assured that Tom and his LEMA team will be on site helping in any way they can. As Director of LEMA, he coordinates the efforts of the Village and Township to prepare for, respond to, mitigate and recover from disasters, both natural and manmade. He also works with the schools on tornado preparedness and shelter management.

As a member of the State of Illinois EMAT (Emergency Management Assistance Team), Tom has helped out many other towns throughout Illinois after natural tragedies, including Harrisburg's and Coal City's tornado, and being deployed to Anna in southern Illinois after the December/January flooding. After Lemont's devastating tornado on March 27, 1991, as Communications Officer for ESDA, Tom coordinated radio

communications for the Village and Red Cross for distributing food, and providing communications for shelters with HAM operators.

Tom's other involvements include:

- Enlisted in the Air Force in August of 1968 and served in Vietnam from 1970-71.
- · Member of the Bolingbrook Amateur Radio Society and is a HAM operator and past president for three years.
- · Will County Mutual Aid Association Partnership member and previous board member for several years.
- IESMA Member (Illinois Emergency Services Management Association).
- EMAT Member (Emergency Management Assistance Team).
- · LEMA Member (Lemont Emergency Management Agency).
- · Volunteer radio operator for the Chicago Marathon.
- Partner with Cook and Will County Mutual Aids.
- Partner with Local Emergency Planning Commission of DuPage and Cook Counties.



#### **SALTING AND SNOW REMOVAL**

The Public Works Department begins ice and snow control measures even before hazardous road conditions are expected. As soon as conditions warrant it, the salting process begins on major streets designated as primary routes, hills, curves, and all intersections. Residential streets that are relatively flat will be salted only at intersections. Salt remains the most cost effective means of breaking the bond between ice and the street, especially with Lemont's unique topography.

Plowing commences after snow accumulates to an inch or more. Village roadways are divided into 9 zones for the plowing process with primary routes, including hills and school bus routes, being plowed first. As soon as primary routes are cleared, crews will move on to the secondary routes. After all streets are open, trucks will begin the curbing operation.

The goal of the Public Works Department is to remove snow from all streets within six hours after the conclusion of a significant snowfall. Your cooperation in removing vehicles from the street and observing the odd-even parking regulations will make this job easier and more efficient.

#### WINTER PARKING REMINDER

During and after any snowfall, please try to remove vehicles from Village streets if at all possible to facilitate clearing. If removing vehicles is not possible, AFTER a snowfall of 2 inches or more, please park on the ODD-numbered side of the street on odd calendar days, EVEN-numbered side of the street on even calendar days. The day is considered to begin at 9:00 a.m.

#### **EMERGENCIES DURING A WINTER STORM**

If an emergency arises during a winter storm, residents should dial 911. All Public Works plowing vehicles maintain continuous two-way radio communication with the Police Department. Snow removal equipment can provide immediate support to ambulance and fire equipment.

#### **DAMAGED PROPERTY**

The Village replaces mailboxes that have been damaged through direct contact with a snow plow, if the original mailbox was installed in compliance with Village regulations. If your mailbox is struck, a temporary repair will be made so that you can continue to receive mail delivery. When winter ends and the ground thaws, final repairs will be made. If replacement of the mailbox or post is required, a standard metal rural size mailbox and 4 x 4 wooded wolmanized post kit will be utilized. All final mailbox repairs are typically completed by early spring.

# PLEASE COMPLETE THE ONLINE SURVEY – YOUR INPUT IS NEEDED ELECTRONIC & HAZARDOUS WASTE RECYCLING

The Village of Lemont has been researching electronic and hazardous waste recycling options for residents due to the expense, inconvenience and limited amount of facilities accepting items. We are currently considering a new program with Waste Management and would like your feedback on this expanded household and electronic recycling program. The "At Your Door" program allows residents to simply call the service to schedule a collection, then, on your scheduled pick up day, you place your items near your front door step or garage. Many items are accepted including electronics and TV's, household chemicals, automotive products, paint products, garden chemicals, universal materials such as CFL bulbs and batteries, and swimming pool chemicals. The program also accepts properly contained medical sharps.

The cost of this service upgrade through Waste Management is \$1.25 per month, with unlimited recycling pickups. The program is not an opt-in program, and all residents would be required to be enrolled in the program for a period of one year, at which time the service would be re-evaluated. The additional charge would appear on all Waste Management customer bills. Several towns already utilize this program, including Chicago Ridge, Elwood, Hickory Hills, Plainfield and Shorewood. They have indicated on WM's own survey, that they are especially satisfied with the flexibility and ease of the whole process.

# LANDSCAPE WASTE COLLECTION ENDS THE FIRST FULL WEEK IN DECEMBER

All landscape waste, including brush and other branches will be collected once per week on the same day as the regular refuse and recycling collection from April 1 through the first full week of December each year. Landscape waste materials should adhere to the following requirements:

- place in biodegradable paper "kraft" type bags, up to 33 gallons in capacity.
- shrubbery cuttings, tree branches, twigs, must be placed either in a kraft paper bag OR in a securely tied bundle,
- · ties must be made of string or twine,
- · branch bundles must not exceed 4 feet in length, and
- bags containing landscape waste and/or branch bundles cannot exceed 50 pounds in weight.

#### **HOW TO REPORT A STREET LIGHT OUTAGE**

To report a street light outage, go to our Village website's bottom feature bar, and click on, "Report A Concern." Navigate to Streets

& Public Places, Streetlights. Please report the tag number located on the pole. The yellow tag number will start with either a C or V, maintained by ComEd or the Village of Lemont. You may report the ComEd lights to the Village, who will then report the outage to ComEd. Residents can also call Public Works at (630) 257-2532 between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.



#### **LEMONT PLACED ON NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES**

Through the dedicated work of the Historic Preservation Commission and Village staff, areas of Downtown Lemont were placed on the National Register of Historic Places on June 6, 2016. The National Register is an official listing of historic places worthy of preservation. This area roughly bounds along Main, Stephen, Illinois, River and Front Streets.

This is not the first area of Lemont to be listed on the Register. The Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal Historic District; Lemont Central Grade School; Lemont Methodist Episcopal Church, known as the Old Stone Church and museum and home to the Lemont Area Historical Society; and St. James Catholic Church and Cemetery are also listed. We thank the Historic Preservation Commission and Village staff for their continued dedication in preserving our cherished history.
