From the Mayor's Desk

The Village remains a strong community and has an increasing percentage of new housing starts and proposed new developments. Overall, in 2014, we had the most single-family homes break ground within the past seven years, with a total of 78 starts. Many economic factors lead to this upturn, and one sure sign is increased employment with families being able to purchase new homes. The Village will continue to collaborate on this controlled growth with our fellow taxing bodies, which includes



the Lemont Fire Protection District, Lemont High School, Lemont-Bromberek Combined SD113A, Lemont Public Library and Lemont Township. New business growth also continues in town, which provides local employment and increases our overall tax base; your support will help them succeed. We continue to utilize our ilivelemont website, www.ilivelemont. com, to direct potential shoppers, business, and residents into Lemont. There is much more in store for 2015 and it takes each and every one of us to help Lemont continue to thrive as a community.

On January 12, Marc Maton was sworn in as the new Chief of Police for the Village of Lemont. It is with great pleasure that I welcome him to our Village, and look forward to all he has to offer to our Police Department and community. Chief Maton began his law enforcement career as an Illinois State Police Trooper in 1986. From 1988 through 2003, his primary assignments were in drug units and multi-jurisdictional task forces. He was appointed as the Chief of Field Operations in 2009, and then in 2012, was appointed Deputy Director of the Division of Forensic Services. In the summer of 2013, Chief Maton became the Deputy Director of the Division of Administration where he retired in December 2014. He also holds a Bachelor's Degree from Northwestern University and a Master's in Law Enforcement Administration from Western Illinois University. Chief Maton's wealth of experience in these areas brings an impressive mix of knowledge to the position. Vehicle Stickers On Sale Starting June 1, 2015

Vehicle stickers are required for all vehicles registered in the Village of Lemont. The two year sticker is to be posted by August 1, 2015, and will expire on July 31, 2017. Stickers can be purchased for \$96.00 per passenger vehicle through July 31, 2015. Passenger vehicle stickers purchased after the July 31, 2015 expiration date will increase to \$146.00. Other vehicle prices are listed in the chart below.

Upon the purchase of a new vehicle, the owner shall have 30 days to purchase a vehicle sticker at the rate of \$96.00. Stickers purchased after the 30 days will be at the rate of \$146.00.

Fill out the Vehicle Sticker Application form located on the Village website, www. lemont.il.us, and from the left sidebar, select, *Vehicle Sticker Info*. Stickers may be purchased in person at either the Village Hall or the Lemont Police Facility locations listed below. Stickers may also be purchased by mail (*if mailed, please send completed form and your check directly to the Lemont Village Hall at 418 Main Street*).

Voters Information for the April 7 Consolidated Election

Voter Registration Information

In order to cast a ballot in the April 7, 2015 Consolidated Election, voters must be registered. To find out if you are registered, check the Cook County Clerk's website at www.cookcountyclerk.com.

Grace Period Registration Ends April 4

Grace period registration and voting extends the registration period by allowing voters to register and vote until the Saturday before an election. It is also the only way to vote if you are not registered or if your voter registration is not up to date. However, guidelines limit when and where grace period registrants can vote. Please visit www.cookcountyclerk.com/elections for locations and times.

Mail Voting

Any registered suburban Cook County voter may apply for a mail ballot. Mail ballot application forms can be downloaded and printed at www.cookcountyclerk.com or call the Clerk's office at (312) 603-0946 to request that an application be mailed to you. Applications are available at the Village Hall and Lemont Township Office. The deadline to apply is April 2, and mail ballots must be postmarked by April 6.

Early Voting - March 23 - April 4

Any registered voter may cast a ballot at one of the Cook County Clerk's early voting sites from March 23 through April 4. Lemont residents may vote early at the Lemont Public Library. Please call the Library at (630) 257-6541 for hours.

NOTICE

With construction season being just around the corner, please remember: Most projects require building permits and inspections to comply with Zoning and Building codes. If there is any doubt, contact the Building Department to find out if you need a permit for your project and we will help you through the process. Call (630) 257-1580 for more information.

Swimming Pools

Swimming Pools 24" and higher require a building permit and a 5' protective barrier.

Boat, Camper, Trailer Storage/Parking

Village ordinance requires that boats, campers, or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2704.



Lawn Sprinkler Valves Require Testing Annually

Lawn Sprinkler RPZ valves **must** be tested annually by a certified technician to prevent contamination of the public water supply by faulty valves.

The inspection certificate must be submitted to the Building Department following the inspection. A list of certified inspectors can be found on the Village website at www.lemont.il.us.

Motor Oil Recycling

Collecting used motor oil, fuel oil, lubricant oil, brake/transmission fluid and antifreeze. CITGO Refinery

Document Disposal

Dispose of personal papers safely and securely. All documents will be shredded on site. *Paper recycling will be limited to 100 lbs. per citizen. Business paper recycling will NOT be accepted. CITGO Refinery*

Electronics Recycling

Dispose of outdated electronic equipment including PCs and computer peripherals, servers, networking equipment, stereo & home entertainment equipment & phone equipment. **E-Scrap Technologies**

Televisions, Monitors and Microwaves

Accepting televisions, monitors and microwaves for recycling. **Public Works**

Prescription Medication Collection

Dispose of unused and outdated prescription medications safely while saving our water supply. **Lemont Police Department**

Toner Cartridge - Printer Inks - Cell Phones

Bring these items for recycling and re-use. Lemont Combined School District 113A

CFL Light Bulb Collection

Accepting used CFL and up to 4-foot fluorescent light bulbs. **CFL bulbs may <u>NOT</u>** be disposed of in the trash. **CITGO Refinery**

Battery Collection

Accepting rechargeable batteries only (including NiCd, NiMH, Lithium Ion) and button batteries (watches, hearing aids) for proper disposal. *Alkaline batteries can be disposed as general refuse as they are no longer considered hazardous. Alkaline batteries and lead-acid batteries (car, marine) will NOT be accepted. CITGO Refinery*

Emerald Ash Borer Update



The mass removal process of affected Emerald Ash Borer trees continues. The Village will begin replacing parkway trees in the fall as budget allows, but this process will take several years. If a homeowner wishes, you can purchase and plant a new parkway tree at your own expense in the parkway adjacent to your home. No permit is required; however, the tree species should be an approved parkway tree species, and trees should be planted in accordance with the Village parkway tree planting specifications.
