From the Mayor's Desk -

Congratulations to our re-elected Trustees, Debby Blatzer, Rick Sniegowski and Ron Stapleton who were sworn in at the May 11 Village Board Meeting. With a combined 34 years of service to our Village, we thank them for their continued commitment. Our Village Clerk, Charlene Smollen, celebrated 30 years as the Lemont Village Clerk in May as well. Thank you Charlene for your continued support to our Village. I also would like to congratulate the newly elected members of all the Lemont taxing districts. I look forward to working with all the boards and commissions in continuing to achieve our collective vision for the community.



I am proud to announce that we had another successful event for the 2015 Mayor's Drive for Charity on April 27, and raised about \$36,000 of which the proceeds will be distributed to over 40 local non-profit and community organizations. Special thanks to Ruffled Feathers Golf Club, the sponsors, volunteers and players who made it all possible. I also would like to thank our partners, volunteers and community members that made this year's Quarryman Challenge once again, a resounding success. Including a record number of runners, the event attracted over 1,000 people to our town. Because of the outstanding community support for the event, the Quarryman Challenge has grown to the ranks of one of the top rated races in the Chicagoland area, and has provided excellent community exposure.

On a negative note, the rumbling continues as to what the outcome will be for our local government distributive funds as the State tries to mend their budget issues. Due to this unknown factor, our fiscal year 2015-2016 operating and capital budget was passed by the Village Board on April 13 with the assumption of a 50% cut in our local government distributive funds. While the passed budget includes the majority of our programs and services, we are delaying our road program, reducing our capital equipment expenditures and deferring several other departmental requests.

From the Mayor's Desk

Licenses

Despite the delay or potential cut altogether in many Village programs and projects, we will be continuing with economic development initiatives, road resurfacing in conjunction with our water main replacement program, and the continued expansion of our utilities to the east side of the Village. Please read our construction update for the projects that will be taking place this year and check our Village website for updates as they are made available.

If the state proposal becomes a reality, the Village of Lemont would lose \$850,000 annually causing services and programs in the community to be drastically affected. The Village of Lemont urges residents to help protect our local funding. A website, ProtectMyTown.com, was launched in conjunction with several municipalities, for residents to voice their opposition to a state proposal aimed at taking local revenue to fix the state's budget problem. Vehicle stickers are required for all vehicles registered in the Village of Lemont. The two year sticker is to be posted by August 1, 2015, and will expire on July 31, 2017. Stickers can be purchased for \$96.00 per passenger vehicle through July 31, 2015. Passenger vehicle stickers purchased after the July 31, 2015 expiration date will increase to \$146.00. Other vehicle prices are listed in the chart.

2014 Water Quality Report

Our 2014 water quality in Lemont has met all of the USEPA drinking water requirements and standards. Each year, the Village of Lemont provides its customers with an Annual Water Quality Report to let them know how our water quality stacks up against established federal and state drinking water standards. Electronic Recycling



Lemont Public Works Department will no longer be accepting electronic items for recycling due to the implementation of fees associated with this service. There are various electronic recycling options available to Lemont residents.

Will County Green:

Front Door Collection service is available to Lemont residents through Vintage Tech Recyclers for a fee of \$25 per service call. This information can be found on the Will County Green website, or call Vintage Tech directly at (866) 631-1707, M-F from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

VetTech.US: E-waste collections for recycling help fund veteran training and are used in their free IT training program. Construction Projects

- Ledowchowski Street water main replacement and roadway resurfacing will take place this summer from Schultz Street to McCarthy Road.
- Crestview Drive water main replacement and roadway resurfacing will take place this summer from Keepataw Drive to Hillview Drive.
- Stephen Street water main replacement from River Road north 300 ft. will take place this fall.
- Hillview Drive storm sewer work will begin this fall from Crestview Drive to Keepataw Drive.

The Village website will contain updates on the projects as they become available.

Boat, Camper, Trailer Storage / Parking



Village ordinance requires that boats, campers or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2704.

Residents Asked to Monitor Ash Trees

Although the Public Works Department conducts routine visual inspections, residents are being asked to monitor ash trees particularly in the parkway for signs of distress. The borer kills trees from the inside out, planting eggs inside ash trees. The larvae then eat the tissue of the tree causing it to die. The beetles emerge shortly after Memorial Day and spread to other trees. The signs to watch for are:

- Die-back at the crown of the tree.
- "S" Shaped galleys or tunnels on tree trunks.
- "D" Shaped emergence holes.

New Program For Lawn Sprinkler and Commercial RPZ Certification



The Village of Lemont has contracted with Backflow Solutions, Inc. (BSI) to administer our cross-connection control/backflow tracking program. The Village will be utilizing BSI Online for all test report submittals.

Effective April 16, 2015, all annual backflow assembly test reports

must be submitted electronically via the BSI Online system at www. bsionlinetracking.com by the testing company. Please note there is a filing fee of \$12.95 per test report submitted.

Each resident who owns a backflow assembly (RPZ valve) was sent a notification letter from BSI with a Customer Confirmation Number (CCN). This number must be given to the tester in order for the reports to be properly filed with BSI.

Odd-Even Watering Regulations Are In Effect

Properties with an odd number address may water on odd numbered calendar days. Properties with an even numbered address may water on even numbered calendar days. Furthermore, no lawn sprinkling is allowed from the Village water system between the hours of 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. Odd-even regulations apply until October 1. On the day new sod is laid, residents may water freely (no permit required). Thereafter, the odd-even regulations apply.

Mosquito Abatement

The Public Works Department manages the Village's mosquito abatement program. Residential spraying will be limited only to periods of excessive annoyance and storm drains will be treated regularly. Advance notice before spraying will be given upon request: (630) 257-2532.

How Can You Help?

- Promptly remove standing water from all pots, containers, and tire swings around the yard. Mosquitoes can develop in only five days.
- Keep weeds and grass mowed.
- Keep gutters free of leaves and debris so water runs freely.
- Change the water in bird baths once a week.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs regularly.
- Drain water from pool covers.
