



#### **Sports Complex**

The Village Board is continuing to evaluate the feasibility of bringing a regional municipal owned and operated sports complex to Lemont. The project intends to accomplish many Village goals including the creation of a self-sustaining economic draw to Lemont, as well as facilitating the cleanup and development of a long-time brownfield site with this recreational use. There are several aspects of the project in which the Board will be evaluating in the coming months in order to determine the feasibility of the project. I will be informing residents of any significant updates to the project at Village Board Meetings and on the Village website. #### Mayor's Message (cont'd)

#### **MWRD**

MWRD is moving forward with the expansion of its wastewater treatment facility at the north end of Stephen Street in the downtown. The project began late 2013 and will be completed by summer of 2015. According to the most recent update from MWRD, the blasting of rock, hauling of excavated material and site utility work is scheduled to start towards the end of February and continue into late spring. The majority of the concrete operations will begin early summer, except for minor concrete pours which will occur periodically throughout the project. #### **McCarthy & Walker Intersection Improvements**

The IDOT sponsored Walker and McCarthy Road project will start up this spring with traffic signal electrical work in March or April. Once that is completed, the surface course will be placed on the street, and pavement striping and landscaping work will be completed. The estimated completion date is aimed for the end of May.

#### **Water Main Project**

Pending Village Board approval, the Village will be bidding out the work to replace the water main on Warner Avenue, from 400 feet south of Weiner Avenue to Norton Avenue. The existing 6-inch water main breaks on a regular basis due to its age and the soil conditions in the area. The water service lines to each home will also be replaced up to the property line. Work is expected to commence in May and continue through the end of June, with final pavement patching and landscape restoration. Warner Avenue residents will be notified prior to the start of the work.

#### **CDBG Sidewalk Repair**

The Village received a \$250,000.00 Community Development Grant from Cook County for sidewalk repair/replacement work for the south downtown area. This includes Cass, Division, Fremont, Grant, Holmes, Lemont, Lincoln, and Porter Streets. The purpose of the project is to replace hazardous sidewalk areas, provide ADA ramps where possible, and fill in missing sidewalk gaps. Work is expected to begin in May, and will continue through June of this year.

#### **Voter Registration Information**

In order to cast a ballot in the March 18, 2014 Gubernatorial Primary Election, voters must be registered. To find out if you are registered, check the Cook County Clerk's website at www.cookcountyclerk.com.

#### **Grace Period Registration Ends March 15**

Grace period registration is the only way to register or change your address or name after the regular registration period ended. It is the only way to vote if you are not registered or if your voter registration is not up to date. Grace Period Registration locations include the Downtown Chicago office at 69 W. Washington Street, Room 500, and the Bridgeview location at 10220 S. 76th Avenue. Visit www.cookcountyclerk.com for additional locations.

#### **Mail Voting**

Any registered suburban Cook County voter may apply for a mail ballot. Mail ballot application forms can be downloaded and printed at www. cookcountyclerk.com or call the Clerk's office at (312) 603-0946 to request that an application be mailed to you. Applications are available at the Village Hall and Lemont Township Office. March 13 is the last day to request a mail ballot, including military and overseas voters. March 17 is the last day voted mail ballots can be postmarked for acceptance by the Clerk's office.

Any registered voter may cast a ballot at one of the Clerk's early voting sites from March 3 through March 15. Lemont residents may vote early at the Lemont Public Library. Please call (630) 257-6541 for hours.

#### **Online Utility Bill Payment Option Returns**

Residents can once again pay their utility bill online. Visit the village website, www.lemont.il.us, and choose "Online Utility Payment" from the left side menu. This will bring up the Account Login page where you will enter your account number and full name, *exactly as it appears on your bill.* From there, your payment can be made. #### Online FOIA Center

The Village of Lemont has implemented an Online FOIA Center in which FOIA requests can be submitted through the Village website. There are several advantages in utilizing our Online FOIA Center. First off, your request will automatically be sent to the appropriate FOIA officer based on the selected category. You will also receive a confirmation of the receipt of your FOIA. In addition, you are able to track the status of your request and communicate with the respective FOIA officer. The Online FOIA Center houses an archive of past FOIA requests and responses since its implementation of February 1, 2014. Swimming Pools 24" and higher require a building permit and a 5' protective barrier.

# Boat, Camper, Trailer Storage/Parking

Village ordinance requires that boats, campers or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2704.



# Lawn Sprinkler Valves Require Testing Annually

Lawn Sprinkler RPZ valves **must** be tested annually by a certified technician to prevent contamination of the public water supply by faulty valves.
