From the Mayor's Desk

Electric Aggregation Process

The residents of Lemont passed a referendum on March 20th authorizing the Village to engage in municipal aggregation. This process allows the Village to bundle all residential and small commercial electric accounts and seek an alternate provider of power in the hopes of offering a lower cost supplier for its residents. The Village Board has passed all necessary ordinances to engage in this process, and we expect the process to begin in early summer. Opt-out notices are expected to be mailed to residents in July. It's important to know that if you want to participate in the program the Village chooses, you need not do anything and you will automatically be included. If you do not want to participate in the Village's program, you must follow the instructions indicated on the card and return it as directed. Residents who have previously switched electric suppliers and want to be included in the Village's program should contact their supply company directly for their cancellation policy. Strategic Planning

At the State of the Village Address on March 7th the Village Board's efforts in establishing a strategic plan were introduced. The Village's strategic plan is a formalized roadmap focusing on our goals, vision and values for the community over the next three years. Through this planning process, five strategic priorities were defined along with their key performance indicators. Currently, a plan of action is being designed to achieve the intended results for the strategic priorities. The Village Board established the following as the main strategic priorities for the next 3 years: Financial Stability, Economic Development and Redevelopment, Quality Infrastructure, Workforce Development, and Intergovernmental Cooperation. When the plan is finalized in the coming months, it will then be made available for the residents to view on the Village website.

Village Hall Rehabilitation

The 120 year-old Village Hall will soon be getting its first facelift in over 20 years. The remodel project will address numerous deferred maintenance issues and resolve other building code related and operational issues. The project is expected to begin around July 1st and will end shortly after Thanksgiving. Because of the nature of the construction taking place, the entire Village Hall will need to be vacated for the duration of the project. In a display of true intergovernmental cooperation, School District 113A will be providing a temporary home for Village Hall functions at its Central School facility at 410 McCarthy Rd. All Village Hall services will continue to be offered at this location, and all phone numbers will remain the same. Beginning in July, the Village Board, Committee of the Whole and Planning and Zoning Commission Meetings will be held in the Large Training Room at the Lemont Police Department, 14600 127th St. In addition, the Commission Meetings for the Environmental Advisory and Historic Preservation will be held in the small Conference Room at the Police Department. These meeting will follow their regular scheduled dates and times unless otherwise indicated. Any questions regarding meeting schedules can be directed to (630) 257-1590 or vlemont@lemont.il.us. On behalf of the Village Board I would like to thank the School District 113A Board of Education for accommodating the Village during the renovation.

Summer Construction Projects

This summer, once again the Village will be resurfacing its roads and replacing its old water mains. Sections of water main will be replaced on Logan Street and McCarthy Road. In addition, Timberline Drive from Roberta to 127th Street along with Doolin Street will be resurfaced this summer. Further, the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) with the assistance from the Village of Lemont will be fully upgrading the McCarthy/Derby/Archer intersection with enhanced signalization and turn lanes, sidewalks and other related improvements. While excited that this key intersection is finally being reconstructed, the Village recognizes the impact the construction will have on businesses and residents in the area. The Village will coordinate with IDOT to make the process as painless as possible. Construction is expected to begin in late summer and finish in late fall.

Mayor's Drive for Charity

On June 11, about 40 Lemont non-profit and community organizations will receive a share of a \$30,000 profit raised this year in the Mayor's Drive for Charity. This money will go back into the community to provide assistance to residents in need and further the goals of these organizations. Special thanks to Ruffled Feathers Golf Club, the sponsors, volunteers and players who have made it possible.

New Subdivision Ready to Break Ground

In September, 2009 the Village Board approved preliminary plans for a 34-unit townhouse development on 4.76 acres at the northeast corner of 127th Street and Thornberry Drive. Last year McNaughton Development, Inc. sold the site to M/I Homes, Inc., a national homebuilder that until recently had primarily built homes in the eastern region of the United States.



In April the Village Board approved the final plans and plat for the subdivision, known as "Briarcliffe Townhomes." M/I Homes has filed site development and building permit applications. The company intends to begin site grading and construction of model townhomes in early summer. This will be the first new subdivision to break ground and construct homes in the Village since 2006. The last time more than 40 new dwelling units were constructed in the Village within one calendar year was 2008. As of mid-May this year, the Village has issued seven permits for new home construction. That figure is anticipated to climb as the construction season gets underway.

ComEd Storm Communications: New Enhancements For Customers

ComEd has taken significant steps to greatly enhance customer communications for the upcoming storm season. Also, beginning this month, customers can now text in their outages and ComEd will text back updates pertaining to their outage request. Building Department

Lawn Sprinkler Valves Testing Required Annually

Lawn Sprinkler RPZ valves must be **tested annually** by a certified technician to prevent contamination of the public water supply by faulty valves.

The inspection certificate must be submitted to the Building Department following the inspection.

Boat, Camper, Trailer Storage/Parking

Village ordinance requires that boats, campers or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2725,

PLEASE NOTE:

Swimming Pools 24" and higher require a building permit and a 5' protective barrier. Call (630) 257-1580 for more information.

Public Works

Mosquito Abatement

The Public Works Department manages the Village's mosquito abatement program. Residential spraying will be limited only to periods of excessive annoyance and storm drains will be treated regularly. Advance notice before spraying will be given upon request: (630) 257-2532.

How Can You Help?

- Promptly remove standing water from all pots, containers, and tire swings around the yard. Mosquitoes can develop in only five days.
- Keep weeds and grass mowed.
- Keep gutters free of leaves and debris so water runs freely.
- Change the water in bird baths once a week.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs regularly.
- Drain water from pool covers.
- Take all recommended precautions to avoid mosquito bites. Use DEET insect repellent when outdoors.



Animal Control

Residents are reminded that, by Village Ordinance, all dogs, cats and pets must be under the control of their owner at all times. This means that the dog, cat, or pet is on a leash not more than eight feet in length; within a private vehicle being driven or parked; or in the property of their owner. Also, pet owners are required to clean up after their animals.

Odd-Even Watering Regulations in Effect



Properties with odd-numbered addresses may water on odd-numbered calendar days; even-numbered addresses may water on even-numbered calendar days between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. Odd-even regulations apply until October 1.

On the day new sod is laid, residents may water freely (no permit required). Thereafter, the odd-even regulations apply.

Residents Asked to Monitor Ash Trees

Although the Public Works Department conducts routine visual inspections, residents are being asked to monitor ash trees particularly in the parkway for signs of distress. The borer kills trees from the inside out, planting eggs inside ash trees. The larvae then eat the tissue of the tree causing it to die. The beetles emerge shortly after Memorial Day and spread to other trees. The signs to watch for are:

- **Die-back at the crown of the tree.**
- **"S" Shaped galleys or tunnels on tree trunks.**
- **"D" Shaped emergence holes.**
