### From the Mayor's Desk

#### **Electric Aggregation**

Letters announcing FirstEnergy Solutions as our electric supplier should have been received by Village residents. We look forward to the implementation of the program and for participants with FirstEnergy Solutions to begin seeing the savings on their ComEd bill. The majority of the account transitions will take place in October with the remainder wrapping up in November. Participating residents and small businesses are expected to see a 42% savings or about \$300 per year for the average household.



Benefits to our program include no early termination fee for residents if they decide to leave the program prior to the two year contract term. If residents initially chose to opt out of our program and then later decide to join, you can do so with no fee by contacting FirstEnergy Solutions during the contract term. Also, should ComEd's rate drop below the current aggregation price, FirstEnergy Solutions must match the rate offered by ComEd, or terminate their service and return the participants to ComEd.

Residents who have already contracted with another supplier have the ability to opt in to the Village's program with FirstEnergy. You are advised to contact your current supplier to determine whether you are subject to an early termination fee. If you then choose to go with FirstEnergy, contact them directly and they will assist you. It's important to know that ComEd imposes a 12-month stay period. This means that if you are with a different supplier and switch back to ComEd, you must switch to a new supplier within two months or you will be subject to stay with ComEd for a 12-month period.

#### **Solicitation in Lemont**

The Village Board recently passed an ordinance to amend our Village Code as it relates to solicitation to be within the jurisdiction pursuant to the recent changes to the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-80-9). This will affect solicitation taking place in the public way, better known as "Tag Day," and solicitation not occurring on the public way, i.e., door-to-door, out of vehicles or other requested locations.

Many local and surrounding charitable and non-profit organizations rely on Tag Days as a key means of fundraising. Below are the amended requirements so you are prepared for your next Tag Day event:

- A Certificate of Registration form must be completed with the required information no later than 10 days before the date the solicitation is to begin. Forms are available from the Administration Department at the Village Hall (Central School).
- Proof of a valid liability insurance policy in the amount of at least \$1,000,000 insuring the applicant(s) against bodily injury and property damage arising out of or in connection with the solicitation is required.
- Any additional information as deemed necessary to process the application, such as requests for the names and identification numbers of the solicitors.

Solicitation requests not occurring on the public way require additional information. Questions can be directed to our Administration Department.

# Register to Vote November 6 Presidential Election



#### **Voter Registration Information**

In order to cast a ballot in the November 6 Presidential Election, voters must be registered. Not sure if you are registered? Check the County Clerk's web site at www.cookcountyclerk.com.

#### **Mail-In Application Form**

You can complete a mail-in voter application form and return it to the Cook County Clerk's office. Voter registration applications are available at www.cookcountyclerk.com.

#### **In-Person with a Certified Registrar**

Eligible voters can register to vote in person at one of the following Lemont locations:

- Lemont Public Library, 50 E. Wend Street, Monday Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. *For registration after* 5:00 p.m. and on weekends, please call ahead at (630) 257-6541.

- Lemont Village Hall (Central School), 410 McCarthy Road, Monday Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. *Please call ahead for availability at (630) 257-1550*.

#### **Grace Period Registration and Voting: October 10 - November 3**

Grace period registration and voting is the only way to register or change your address or name after the regular registration period ends. It is also the only way to vote if you are not registered or if your voter registration is not up to date. Grace Period Registration locations include the Downtown Chicago office at 69 W. Washington Street, Room 500, and the Bridgeview location at 10220 S. 76th Avenue. Visit www.cookcountyclerk.com for additional locations.

#### **Absentee Voting**

Any registered suburban Cook County voter may apply for a mail ballot. It is no longer necessary to provide a reason. Applications to vote by mail can also be downloaded and printed at <a href="https://www.cookcountyclerk.com">www.cookcountyclerk.com</a> or by calling the Clerk's office at (312) 603-0946 to request that an application be mailed to you. Applications will be available at the Village Hall (Central School) and Lemont Township Office in late September. Absentee ballots must be postmarked by November 5 and received in the County Clerk's office within 14 days after the election in order to be counted for acceptance by the Clerk's office. November 1 is the last day to request a mail ballot. Any voter needing or wishing to vote in the final two days prior to the election may vote in person at any of the Clerk's six office locations, including Chicago and Bridgeview.

#### **Early Voting: October 22 - November 3**

Any registered voter may cast a ballot at one of the Clerk's early voting sites from October 22 through November 3. Lemont residents may vote early at Lemont Public Library, 50 E. Wend Street. Please call (630) 257-6541 for hours.

# Annual Water Rate Increase Effective October 1

Beginning October 1, a slight increase in the water rates will become effective. The rate for the first 4,000 gallons will increase from \$30.48 to \$31.39, and each additional thousand gallons will increase from \$5.93 per 1,000 gallons to \$6.05 per thousand. **Senior Rates remain unchanged.** 

These annual incremental increases are necessary to keep up with the costs to maintain and improve the Village's water system.

# Volunteers Sought for Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee

In June, the Village adopted an Active Transportation Plan aimed at making Lemont a safer and more convenient place for people to walk, bike, and use transit. The plan identified infrastructure and non-infrastructure recommendations for the community's pedestrian, bicycle, and transit network. The Village is now working on implementing the plan and is seeking volunteers to serve on a Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee. The committee will be working to prioritize and execute recommendations from the plan that will promote active transportation choices. #### Lemont Express Car Wash Expanding

Reconstruction of the Lemont Express Car Wash on State Street (adjacent to McDonald's) is well underway. The existing car wash was demolished, and in its place will be a new car wash that owner Bill Klump promises will be "faster, cheaper, better." The least expensive wash will be \$3.00, and Lemont Express Car Wash will offer a club plan for individuals and fleet accounts for businesses. For fun, Bill added a two-bay pet wash. "Bring Snoopy," he says, "walk him or her into their own private bath, hook the collar to the tether, and enjoy the warm water, soaps, and shampoo. Leave the clean-up to us."

Bill adds: "That we choose to invest in Lemont is a tribute to our loyal customers, as well as our elected officials and staff. Lemont is a winner, and Lemont Express Car Wash wants, and needs, to expand our presence in this village." Anticipated opening is October.

#### 312 Canal Street Renovation Complete

The façade of 312 Canal Street, or Hennebry Hall as it was once known, is complete. The building, which dates from the late 19th century, is still in the Hennebry family. The renovation included: repair of the limestone coping, re-construction of the top courses of the parapet, replacement of the storefront and windows, repair of window stone sills, and waterproofing. Cost of the repairs exceeded \$40,000, of which the Village will contribute \$15,000 under its Downtown Façade, Sign, and Site Improvement Grant Program. The program was reinitiated in 2010, and offers reimbursement of up to 50 percent of improvement costs, up to a maximum of \$15,000. #### Landscape Waste Pick-Up Ends November 30



Residents are reminded that the yard waste pick-up will end for the year on November 30 when the land-fill will close until spring. Wrap up those pruning and clean-up projects before this date.

The yard waste collection is FREE – no stickers required for Village residents for leaves and other yard debris if placed in a kraft paper yard waste bag and left at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your regular trash pick-up day.

Branches are also picked up as a free service BUT be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine. (Branches in cans will not be accepted nor will unbundled branches.)
- Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 2 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds. No wider than 2 feet.

When Using Cell Phones to Call 911

When you call 911 from your cell phone, the nearest available cell tower transmits your cell signal to the 911 dispatch center. Unfortunately, the available cell tower may be in a different city or county from where the emergency is located, so you may be talking to the wrong 911 dispatch center.

When the 911 dispatch center answers your cellular call, make sure you give the address and town where you need emergency assistance. Request "Lemont Police" if the emergency is in the Village. The 911 dispatch center can transfer your cell call to the correct 911 dispatch center immediately. This will save time and improve response.

#### National Law Enforcement Challenge Award Winners

The International Association of Chiefs of Police recently announced the winners of the 2011 National Law Enforcement Challenge Award. The Lemont Police placed first out of 57 applicants for Municipal agencies with 11-25 police officers. This is the fourth time that the Department has placed in the National Competition. The Department has also placed four times in the State Competition.

The National Law Enforcement Challenge is a recognition program that gives agencies that take the extra steps to save lives and reduce injuries proactively through its highway safety efforts. This program promotes professionalism in traffic safety enforcement and encourages agencies to share best practices and programs with each other.

The National Award will be presented at the Law Enforcement Challenge Luncheon at the International Association of Chiefs of Police Annual Conference in San Diego, California.



#### Receive Important Text Messages from the Village

Residents now have the ability to receive important text message notifications to your cell phone from the Village. Simply text our zip code, 60439, to 888777. There is no charge for this service. However, standard text messaging rates through your phone service will apply. You can opt-out any time by texting "stop" to 888777.

#### Halloween Safety Tips From the Police Department

Trick or Treaters should be accompanied by a trusted adult. Older children going alone should have a set time to return within the trick or treating hours. Have them wear a watch and carry a cell phone.

Costumes using make-up and face paint are safer than an ill-fitting mask. Children should wear comfortable, light colored clothing that is flame retardant and short enough to avoid tripping. Reflective tape on costumes, glow necklaces, flashing buttons and flashlights will all help make them stand out in the dark. Costume props should be flexible and not sharp.

Remind children of pedestrian and stranger safety rules and to only cross streets at intersections and crosswalks. Obey all traffic signs and signals. Stop, look left-right-left again and listen for cars. Walk, don't run across streets. Walk on sidewalks or on the left side of the street facing traffic.

Never allow a child to eat a treat that has not been checked by a responsible adult. Discard fruit, unwrapped items, homemade goodies or any treat with a loose or torn wrapper.
