## From the Mayor's Desk



As we approach the end of the holiday season and the beginning of another year, as a community we have much to be grateful for. Over the course of this past year, much has been accomplished and we begin to see the glimmer of improvement ahead. Two years ago, a significant topic of discussion in Lemont and many communities was vacancies due to the economic downturn. Over the course of this year I have been pleased to attend many announcements, grand openings and reinvestment of businesses in the community through expansion and renovations. Those vacancies of years past continue to be filled. We had a total of 16 new business openings in 2012.

It is never more important than during this holiday season that we continue to support our local businesses. For a community our size, we truly have a great diversity of business options available from national retailers to numerous boutique type businesses and a great variety of restaurants. ### Construction Projects

were held. There will be some preliminary work done still this year, with heavy construction scheduled to begin mid-March of 2013. It is also anticipated that the Walker/McCarthy intersection improvements will be done next year; however, exact timing with IDOT has not been finalized.

The renovation of our Village Hall is expected to continue into January. We will continue to reside in our temporary location in the Central School building at 410 McCarthy Road until further notice.

### Community

Over the last few months, Lemont-Bromberek CSD 113A has been working diligently to create a five year Strategic Plan for the district. The district has sought input through discussions with parents, district volunteers and partners, local business owners and representatives from local taxing bodies, which I personally participated in. SD113A's Board and staff is wrapping up the data gathering portion of their Strategic Plan in a Community Forum being held on December 4th from 7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. at Old Quarry's Learning Center. During this forum, the district will provide information on what was learned from the information gathering process, and will look to participants for feedback on the information gathered. As a result of this forum, the District's Board of Education will establish district priorities and create an action plan to be accountable for moving forward in the next five years. Your input is important. Help be a part of the vision of public education in our community and join them on December 4th.

There is much that makes our Village a wonderful place to live and work, but ultimately it is the people of Lemont that make it unique. While many of us will be celebrating during this holiday season, there are still those less fortunate in our Village who won't be as merry. ### Reverend Glenn Bergmark Honored as 2012 Citizen of the Year by U.S. Representative Dan Lipinski

Reverend Glenn Bergmark was honored by U.S. Representative Dan Lipinski (IL-3) as one of the recipients of the 2012 Senior Citizen of the Year Award. Seniors were recognized for their volunteerism and involvement in the local communities that make up the Third Congressional District at the award ceremony on October 18th.

Reverend Bergmark was nominated by Mayor Brian Reaves for his countless hours of involvement in the Lemont community for so many organizations, expanding over a period of 47 years. It began in 1965, when he became Pastor of Bethany Lutheran Church where he retired after almost 40 years of service. He currently serves as

# WINTER INFO

## *Winter Parking Reminder*

During and after any snowfall, please try to remove vehicles from Village streets if at all possible to facilitate clearing. If removing vehicles is not possible,

**after a snowfall of 2 inches  
PARK ON THE  
odd-numbered side of the street  
on odd calendar days,  
even-numbered side of the street on  
even calendar days.**

## Salting and Snow Removal

The Public Works Department begins ice and snow control measures even before hazardous road conditions are expected.

As soon as conditions warrant it, the salting process begins on major streets designated as primary routes, hills, curves and all intersections. Residential streets that are relatively flat will be salted only at intersections. Salt remains the most cost effective means of breaking the bond between ice and the street, especially with Lemont's unique topography.

Plowing commences after snow accumulates to an inch or more. Village roadways are divided into 9 zones for the plowing process with primary routes, including hills and school bus routes being plowed first.

As soon as primary routes are cleared, crews will move on to the secondary routes. After all streets are open, trucks will begin the curbing operation.

The goal of the Public Works Department is to remove snow from all streets within six hours after the conclusion of a significant snowfall.

Your cooperation in removing vehicles from the street and observing the odd-even parking regulations will make this job easier and more efficient.



## Don't Take Chances!

### Winter Storms and Emergencies

If an emergency arises during a winter storm, residents should dial 911. All Public Works plowing vehicles maintain continuous two-way radio communication with the Police Department. Snow removal equipment can provide immediate support to ambulance and fire equipment.

### Damaged Property

Mailboxes in the Village right-of-way are sometimes damaged during snow removal. These will be replaced with a standard rural route mailbox in the spring. To report damage, call the Public Works Department at (630) 257-2532.

## Police Briefs

### Holiday Safety Tips!

As the holiday season nears, please take extra precautions to keep you and your family safe. Following are tips from the National Crime Prevention Council:

#### While Shopping:

- Park in well lit areas and lock doors.
- Purchases should be hidden in the trunk out of view.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Keep purse close to your body and wallets in a front pocket.
- Have a designated meeting place for older children.
- Instruct young children if lost, to go to a sales clerk at a register, request help and remain at the counter until your arrival.
- Children should never return to your vehicle in the parking lot to wait for you!
- Know where to find credit card contact information if they get lost or stolen.

#### At Home:

- Always lock the doors and windows of your home.
- Display gifts where they can't be seen.
- If a delivery person or solicitor comes to your door, ask for official identification through the locked door. Call to verify identity using a number you get through the phonebook or 411, not one they offer you.

#### Vacation Leaves:

- Use an automatic timer for your lights and radio.
- Have a friend or good neighbor watch your residence and make it look inhabited.
- Lemont Police Department offers a Vacation Watch for up to two weeks at a time. Applications are located at the kiosk in the lobby of the Police Department.



Keeping citizens informed.

The Lemont Police Department participates with Southwest Central Dispatch to provide residents with emergency and severe weather alerts by telephone (reverse 911). This program, called CodeRED, is designed to quickly and efficiently deliver targeted emergency notifications, severe weather warnings, road closures, missing child alerts, and other alerts and warnings directly to you by phone. This service is completely voluntary.

You can sign up for CodeRED by visiting <http://www.southwestcentral911.org>. There is a direct link on that page to sign up for the CodeRED alerts. There is also a link from the Village website for CodeRED sign-up. If you need assistance or have additional questions, please contact the Lemont Police Department at (630) 257-2229. There is no cost for this service.



### In an Emergency, Can We Find You?

Make sure your address is visible from the street. If there is a police, fire or medical emergency at your home, can first responders find you fast? Address markers that are hidden by shrubs or trees, or ones that are non-reflecting or unlighted are hard to spot, even by trained emergency personnel. Help us help you! Make sure your address is easily visible. If you have a long driveway, or a shared drive, make sure there are markers at the street, on the house, and at forks in the drive. Large numbers, 3-4 inches high that reflect light are best. It is also helpful if the numbers are visible from both directions on your street and visible at night as well as during the day. Technology is making the job easier, but it's neither foolproof nor perfect. **A well-marked residence or business is the best way to ensure that when you call 9-1-1, we can find you.**

## Odor Alert Network (OAN)

The pioneering environmental initiative to improve air quality in the Lemont area is in its ninth year of operation. This initiative, the Lemont Odor Alert Network (OAN), is focused on resolving nuisance odor problems.

Fewer than 10% of odor complaints were being resolved before the OAN began operation. In its nine years of operation, the OAN has consistently resolved over half of all odor complaints. Ninety-six percent of the odor complaints in the 2010-2011 operating year were resolved and eighty-eight percent of the odor complaints reported in 2011-2012 were resolved.

### How does the OAN work?

Tom Ballard, the Lemont OAN Coordinator, will investigate and respond to each caller. Mark LaChappell and Ed Buettner provide additional support.

Romeoville has now joined the OAN with their own Coordinator and the information is shared mutually with Lemont, which helps identify odor sources that impact both municipalities. Inquiries about the OAN and news of our success has spread regionally. The Lemont OAN is a successful example of how the business community, concerned residents and local government work in cooperation to improve our air quality.

## Important Notice Regarding Your Water Utility Bill If You Pay Online Using Your Bank

Residents who pay their utility bills online using their bank may have noticed some delays in water bill processing. Due to the reconstruction of the Village Hall, all mail has been forwarded to the temporary location at 410 McCarthy Road. Due to the mail being forwarded, it has sometimes taken 30 days to forward, or the mail has been returned to sender. For example: a resident signs on to their bank account and utilizes their online bill pay on the 15th of the month. The paying bank will then send the Village a check for payment of the utility bill. The Village should receive this within 5 business days (in time for the due date of the 20th), but has seen delays of up to 30 days (which would be past the due date).

If you would like to avoid these issues, residents may sign up for Direct Debit; pay their utility bill online via the Village of Lemont website; or temporarily revise the mailing address with your bank to send your check directly to 410 McCarthy Road while the Village Hall remains under renovation. Otherwise, you could see delays in your payment processing.
