

### From the Mayor's Desk

#### **Legislative Districts**

Every 10 years at the conclusion of the census, legislative districts are re-drawn based on shifts in population, and the 97<sup>th</sup> General Assembly is now turning its attention to re-mapping of districts. The recent map proposed by Illinois Senate Democrats and receiving limited approval by the House, keeps Lemont in the 41<sup>st</sup> Senate District and the 82<sup>nd</sup> Representative District. This map could change before it is completely approved by the full legislature, so we will keep you informed as to





Earlier this year, the Village approved the sale of bonds to finance replacement of the ion exchange systems in two of the village's deep wells and make other needed system-wide improvements. The current softening equipment was purchased used 26 years ago and has been in continuous use for 40-50 years. With these upgrades, which will begin this fall, the water system should be in good shape for another 25 years. As part of the project, the 50-year old Houston Street water tower has received a complete and badly-needed overhaul to preserve this asset for the long term. The water main on Houston Street is being replaced and upgraded and that project should be wrapping up by June 15, as will the water main replacement on Kim/Kip/Keepataw. Beginning in July, water main will be replaced on New Avenue from Timberline Drive to State Street and on Illinois Street from Lockport Street to State Street. This project is likely to create some late summer downtown congestion but should be finished by August 30. Work on the Logan Street Dam and the Hillview Ditch scheduled in August will improve flood drainage. Federal funds from the Cook County CDBG program will fund replacement of water main on Stephen Street from Porter south to McCarthy Road in mid-June.

#### Vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Commission

From time to time vacancies occur on Village commissions and advisory boards and there is now a vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Commission. Local government can only be effective with citizen involvement in the process. If you would be interested in serving on a commission, contact the Village Hall for an application at 630-257-1590. A sincere interest and the ability to attend monthly meetings are the only requirements, although in the case of the Planning & Zoning Commission, any previous experience in land use would be desirable.

#### **Antics in Springfield**

Local Mayors have been justifiably upset for the past month at the threat from Springfield to balance the state budget by withholding all money from the Local Government Distributive Fund. The fund is not the state's money. It has belonged to cities and counties since the income tax was instituted over 40 years ago. The state is supposed to collect the money on behalf of local governments and distribute it, and is now at least 5 months behind in its payments.

It is now apparent that the governor's ploy has resulted in the desired outcome – legislation has been introduced to permit the state to issue more bonds to pay some of its past due bills – leaving state taxpayers with additional debt. Keep in mind that the state is already keeping 100% of the recent 66% income tax increase.

Over 3 years ago when the recession began, Lemont began cutting expenditures, freezing hiring and salaries and making the economies of scale necessary to balance budgets based on lower revenue projections. It is a very delicate balance and dependent on receiving every penny of revenue owed to us by the state. Without these funds, there is simply no other place we can cut and still provide police, public works and other vital services to our residents. We will continue to do the best we can with fewer personnel and with the means at our disposal.

#### **Mayor's Drive for Charity**

On June 13, about 40 Lemont non-profits and community organizations will receive a share of the \$26,000 profit raised this year in the Mayor's Drive for Charity. This money will go back into the community to provide assistance to residents in need and further the goals of these organizations. #### Historic Preservation Commission Studies Expansion of Historic District



On April 14, The Historic Preservation Commission held a public information meeting on the possible expansion of the existing Historic District to include a defined area west of State Street. Residents of the study area have received surveys by mail to determine their interest in becoming part of a Historic District.

Since the Commission was formed 10 years ago, it has studied several areas of Lemont that could qualify as historic districts. Celebrating, preserving and maintaining the character of these areas is a goal of the Commission. In order for an area to be added, a minimum of 51% of the residents would have to voluntarily agree to become part of the Historic District by signing a petition to be included.

Studies suggest that historic designation is associated with higher property values (10-15%) in comparison to similar non-historic district areas. Residents often object to the idea of a historic district because they believe that they will somehow lose control of their right to alter their properties. Historic District designation cannot override property owners' rights. Although a review is required only for exterior alterations, it is the role of the Historic Preservation Commission to work with property owners to achieve the best possible restoration for their particular architectural style.

# Residents Asked to Monitor Ash Trees

Reports that the Emerald Ash Borer beetle has infested trees in Burr Ridge means that this devastating pest is now only a few miles away. Although the Public Works Department conducts routine visual inspections, residents are being asked to monitor ash trees particularly in the parkway for signs of distress. The borer kills trees from the inside out, planting eggs inside ash trees. The larvae then eat the tissue of the tree causing it to die. The beetles emerge shortly after Memorial Day and spread to other trees. The signs to watch for are:

- · Die-back at the crown of the tree.
- "S" Shaped galleys or tunnels on tree trunks.
- "D" Shaped emergence holes.

#### Odd-Even Watering Regulations in Effect



Properties with odd-numbered addresses may water on odd-numbered calendar days; even-numbered addresses may water on even calendar days between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. Odd-even regulations apply until October 1.

On the day new sod is laid, residents may water freely (no permit required). Thereafter, the odd-even regulations apply.

#### Did You Know?

Residential outdoor water use in the US accounts for more than 7 billion gallons of water used for landscape irrigation each day. Half of this water is wasted by inefficiencies in irrigation methods and systems.

Weather-based irrigation controllers use local weather and landscape conditions to tailor irrigation schedules to actual conditions. Instead of irrigating on a preset schedule set by a clock timer, weather based controllers allow irrigation to closely match plants' water requirements and can reduce water use by 20%.

Look for Water Sense labeled products that meet the US EPA's water efficiency and performance criteria.

#### Mosquito Abatement

The Public Works Department manages the Village's mosquito abatement program. Residential spraying will be limited only to periods of excessive annoyance and storm drains will be treated regularly. Advance notice before spraying will be given upon request: 630-257-2532.

## Comprehensive Plan Update Underway

The Planning & Zoning Commission and Village staff have conducted initial reviews and discussion on sections of the Comprehensive Plan relating to economic development, natural resources and green initiatives.

The Commission will resume the update in late summer, and is planning a public hearing in August-September to seek resident input on additional aspects of the plan. Public comment will be sought on land use, housing, transportation, economic development, natural resources, historic preservation and the downtown.

Beginning April 1, Will County began offering free household electronic recycling pick-up to Lemont residents.

# Lawn Sprinkler Valves Testing Required Annually

Lawn Sprinkler RPZ valves must be **tested annually** by a certified technician to prevent contamination of the public water supply by faulty valves.

The inspection certificate must be submitted to the Building Department following the inspection.

#### **Boat, Camper, Trailer** Storage/Parking

Village ordinance requires that boats, campers or trailers may only be stored/parked at a residence if located in a garage or other fully enclosed structure that substantially conceals them from public view. A boat, camper or trailer may be parked at a residence for the purpose of loading or unloading for no more than 8 consecutive hours or 12 hours in a 24-hour period.

Non-compliance may result in fines. Any questions regarding the ordinance should be addressed to the Village Code Enforcement Officer at 630-243-2725,
