
5th Annual Kops-N-Kidz Day

## From the Mayor's Desk

## **Lemont in the Limelight**

Many of you have already seen in the news that Lemont will be featured in an upcoming 13-week Public TV series "Built to Last." The Chicago Regional Council of Carpenters and Lakeshore Public Television have chosen the Briarcliffe Subdivision as the location for construction of a sustainable residential building project, and the series will follow construction from the ground up by Chicago area



#### **Construction Projects Underway**

Fall is shaping up to be a busy construction season with several projects still in the process: the State Street and Warner Avenue water main transfer projects; the New Avenue and Main Street water main replacement from Timberline Drive to State Street; and the Illinois Street water main replacement from Lockport Street to State Street. Closure of the Illinois Street ramp between New Avenue and State Street for about 5 days will be necessary the week of September 19. We have been alerted that IDOT will be resurfacing State Street between 127th Street and Archer before October 30, but no definite date has been specified.

The Logan Dam and Freehauf/Hillview Spillway will be thoroughly cleaned and repaired this month for improved function and water flow. Financing for some of these projects was made possible by bidding early on the larger projects—contractors' bids came in under the engineer's budget estimate, freeing up funds for additional necessary work.

A complete reconstruction of Illinois Street has been under discussion by the Board over the past several months. Before the original downtown TIF district sunsets completely in 2014, the Board hopes to get the project underway, using those funds for the local share. Since

Illinois Street does not meet the width standard for 2-way traffic and parking, a variation was applied for in order to retain parking on both sides. The project has now been approved for 70% federal funding through the Southwest Conference of Mayors. A second hurdle is the undergrounding of utilities. While it makes perfect sense to put the utilities underground as part of the project, the large price tag could be a deterrent. The Staff will negotiate with ComEd on the engineering so the Board has a better idea of costs.

#### **Sewer Evaluation Project**

To achieve compliance with IEPA and MWRD mandates, the Village is required to perform an evaluation of the overall sewer system which began last spring. The next step in the process is smoke testing and televising targeted areas, and the first area to be tested will be the Ruffled Feathers Sewer Service Area sanitary sewer system. The purpose of the testing is to determine whether there are non-sump pump sources of inflow and infiltration that may need correction. Similar testing will be conducted in other service area systems until the contributing sources of the overflows can be identified and remediated. In addition, televising and sewer cleaning is scheduled in the Kim/Kim/Cherokee service area to improve flow.

## **Commission Updates**

I would like to acknowledge and thank the citizens who applied to fill the vacancies on the Planning & Zoning Commission. The Village Board selection committee was impressed with the caliber and qualifications of the applicants as well as their desire to serve their community. After interviewing several candidates, the committee recommended the candidates they felt were the best fit for the Commission.

This fall the Commission will resume its update of the Comprehensive Plan, a document which will serve as a development guide for the next several years. Public input is essential in creating a Comprehensive Plan, so I am urging every resident to participate in the process by completing a survey and attending the public meeting later this fall. The Plan was last updated in 2002, almost 10 years ago. During that decade, the face of this community has changed substantially.

On the topic of Commissions, for the past 6 months, the Heritage Committee has been working on a master plan for the Heritage Quarries recreation area with input from Lemont Township and the Park District. The plan expands the opportunities for passive recreation and augments the existing trail system by creating new paths. The Boy Scouts have expressed an interest in constructing a camping area for scouts on the east end of the recreation area. There will be more discussion on the plan at future Committee of the Whole meetings.

## Annual Water Rate Increase Effective October 1

Beginning October 1, a slight increase in the water rates will become effective. The rate for the first 4,000 gallons will increase from \$29.59 to \$30.48, and each additional thousand gallons will increase from \$5.81 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.93 per thousand. **Senior Rates remain unchanged.** 

These annual incremental increases are necessary to keep up with the costs to maintain and improve the Village's water system.

Do you ever walk or bike around Lemont? Do your children walk or bike to school? Would you like to walk or bike to places in town – but don't because you don't feel you can get to your destinations safely?

The Village is creating an Active Transportation Plan for Lemont that will establish our community's goals for walking, bicycling, and other modes of active transportation. We will be seeking your input at two kick-off meetings to hear about your experiences walking and biking in Lemont, and your priorities for future bicycle and pedestrian facilities in the village.

On September 27, 8:30 a.m. at the Village Hall, you will have the opportunity to hear from Mark Fenton, an engaging speaker and one of the nation's foremost experts on walking. Mark is a former member of the United States national racewalking team and host of the new PBS series, America's Walking. A vocal pedestrian advocate and a recognized authority on public health issues, Mark will introduce the group to active transportation planning and explain some of the benefits of encouraging walking and bicycling. Following Mark's speech, we'll head out onto the streets of downtown where Mark will show us some examples of what Lemont is doing right, and where we have room for improvement. After our "walkabout" we'll head back to Village Hall, break out maps of downtown Lemont and get your ideas to improve walking and biking downtown.

On October 19, 6:30 p.m. at Lemont Police Station, 14600 127th Street, you will work side by side with your neighbors using maps to show us where you like to go when you walk or bike. Then we will hear about the improvements that you think are needed to make those trips easier or safer. This event will cover all areas of Lemont, so everyone should attend!

The Active Transportation Plan is being funded by the Communities Putting Prevention to Work Model Communities Grant program. In January, the Village received a \$48,000 grant from this program to fund a variety of efforts aimed at promoting increased physical activity and improved public health.

## Landscape Waste Pick-Up Ends November 24



Residents are reminded that the yard waste pick-up will end for the year on November 24 when the land-fill will close until spring. Wrap up those pruning and clean-up projects before this date.

The yard waste collection is FREE – no stickers required for Village residents for leaves and other yard debris if placed in a kraft paper yard waste bag and left at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your regular trash pick-up day.

Branches are also picked up as a free service **BUT** be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine. (Branches in cans will not be accepted nor will unbundled branches)
- Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds.

## Pet Etiquette Reminder

Pets must be leashed at all times when on public streets, sidewalks, or any public property. When walking pets, do not allow them to stray onto private property or front yards, even when leashed. Village ordinance requires that owners must clean up after pets.

# Halloween Safety Tips From the Police Department

Trick or Treaters should be accompanied by a trusted adult. Older children going alone should have a set time to return within the trick or treating hours. Have them wear a watch and carry a cell phone.

Costumes using make-up and face paint are safer than an ill-fitting mask. Children should wear comfortable, light colored clothing that is flame retardant and short enough to avoid tripping. Reflective tape on costumes, glow necklaces, flashing buttons and flashlights will all help make them stand out in the dark. Costume props should be flexible and not sharp.

Remind children of pedestrian and stranger safety rules. Also, to cross streets at intersections and crosswalks. Obey all traffic signs and signals. Stop, look left-right-left again and listen for cars. Walk, don't run across streets. Walk on sidewalks or on the left side of the street facing traffic.

Never allow a child to eat a treat that has not been checked by a responsible adult. Discard fruit, unwrapped items, homemade goodies or any treat with a loose or torn wrapper.

## Vacant Properties Must Register

Property owners and lending institutions are required to register vacant properties with the Building Department.

A code inspection is now required before occupancy for properties that have been vacant longer than 6 months.

The purpose of these regulations is to prevent vandalism, monitor property maintenance and provide protection for new owners who may be unaware of plumbing or electrical systems that may have deteriorated during the vacancy.
