

# From the Mayor's Desk

# **Meetings with Legislators**

Over the past weeks and months, I have had the occasion to meet frequently with U.S. Representative Judy Biggert over the Asian Carp issue and the proposed closing of the Sanitary & Ship Canal. She is completely versed on the topic and has been a valuable ally in our opposition to closing the Ship Canal. Many local industries including Citgo and IMTT use the canal to transport commodities and would be



forced to close if this transportation source is suddenly no longer available. Recent news reports indicate that the federal government has pledged \$78 million to stop the advancement of the carp into the Great Lakes. Our hope is that the funds will be used to discover alternate solutions rather than closing the locks. The Army Corps of Engineers has submitted a \$13 million plan to construct a permanent dam in the I & M Canal west of downtown Lemont and an impervious barrier in the DesPlaines River to control the carp.

I have also met with area mayors and U.S. Representative Dan Lipinski on the topic of improved rail service on the Heritage Corridor Line. A recent article in the Southtown Star called it the worst of Metra's 11 commuter lines. We applaud Congressman Lipinski for stepping up to bat on this issue, and we pledge to continue our efforts to lobby for additional trains. Funding for the High Speed Rail route from Chicago to St. Louis passing through Lemont has been approved. Final plans and details are not available yet, but if plans proceed as proposed, grade crossing improvements and a "quiet zone" may be possible in the future.

As Mayor, I believe it is important to meet with our legislators and our councils of government. These meetings sometimes reveal previously untapped grant possibilities and resources that could benefit our community.

# **Budget & Finance**

March is typically the month that the Village Board determines its budget and spending priorities for capital projects for the coming fiscal year. All revenues projected to date point

to an even leaner year in 2010, with revenues decreasing by at least \$1.2 million. That said, we still intend to fund a limited road resurfacing program for four of the worst streets due for maintenance. Community Development Block Grant funds will partially fund a water main upgrade on State Street from Illinois to Cass. Previously applied for stimulus funds may fund a sewer project on Warner Avenue and if funds are received, it would be cost effective for the Village to upgrade the water main as part of the project. Stimulus money is also paying for the traffic signal at 127th Street and Timberline Drive. Main Street will be resurfaced in late summer with funding through the Southwest Conference of Mayors. TIF funds will be used for the reconstruction on Talcott Street and revenues generated from commuter parking fees will pay for the resurfacing of the Metra Lot. We continue to explore every avenue for other funding sources for necessary infrastructure improvements to keep the burden away from our taxpayers.

# **Census Forms in the Mail**

By mid-March, every household in Lemont will receive a 2010 Census Form in the mail. I am urging each and every Lemont resident to fill out the 10-question form for each member of the household, put it in the envelope and mail it back. \$400 billion in federal funds for things like roads, schools, grants, along with state-shared revenue are all distributed to municipalities based on census count. That count will follow Lemont as its official population for the next ten years, so it is critical to have an accurate initial count. Census data is tabulated when you return the form, but any personal information provided is sealed by law for 72 years, so it is completely safe. If you should have any questions at all regarding the census, or if you lose the form or do not receive one, please call the Village Hall at (630) 257-1590 and we will try to assist you. If you do not return the form by April 1, you may expect a visit from a census enumerator who will follow up with residents who do not return the form.

# **Downtown Redevelopment**

The Village is in the process of refinancing the public parking garage on River Street. More attractive bond financing rates should save the taxpayers a significant amount of money in interest over the life of the bonds. Much of the garage space is for public use and at this point parking is free—some people I have talked to are not aware that there is public parking. Marquette Companies, the original developer, has refinanced the Front Street Lofts development resulting in much more attractive pricing for the units. As soon as the transaction is final, we should begin to see some of the commercial spaces occupied over the summer.

# **Village Boards & Commissions**

Village commission appointments expire at the end of April and sometimes there are vacancies to be filled. I am seeking civic-minded citizens who might be interested in serving on one of these advisory bodies. All that is required is a sincere interest, a desire to improve your community and your participation at commission meetings. # We Can't Move Forward Until You Mail it Back!

In 1790 the Nation's first census was taken. The form you will receive in March, 2010 is the shortest census form since that time. **Only 10 simple questions are asked for each member of the household. It takes about 10 minutes to complete and is completely safe.** 

# Why should you return the census form?

- Determining congressional seats and distribution of \$400 billion in federal funding are just a hint of the many important uses of census data.
- The federal government uses population data to allocate funds in a number of areas:
  - Title 1 grants to school districts across the nation
  - Head Start programs
  - Women, Infants and Children food grants
  - Public transportation
  - · Road rehabilitation and construction
  - Programs for the elderly
  - Emergency food and shelter
- Census data helps the private sector determine where jobs and job programs are needed.
- Population figures are used to determine locations of highways, hospitals and schools.
- Corporations use population to determine locations for commercial enterprises, such as food stores, pharmacies and other essential services.

# Frequently Asked Questions:

# Can I fill out the Census Form on line?

**Not this time.** Although this is likely to be an option in the future, this time it is necessary to manually fill out the form, put it in the envelope and mail it back in the postage paid envelope. **DO IT!** 

# I am not a U.S. Citizen. Should I fill out the form?

**YES.** The purpose of the Census is to count the entire population. Citizenship is not relevant and there is no question on the form asking whether you are a U.S. Citizen.

Census workers must pass security and employment reference checks. Enumerators will carry and display 2010 Census identification. If you are concerned about a visit from an enumerator, ask to see identification.

# Sewer Rate Increase Coming

Lemont has been notified by MWRD (Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago) and the IEPA (Illinois Environmental Protection Agency) that because both our combined and separated sewer systems are creating sporadic rainfall event overflows into the I & M and the Sanitary & Ship Canals in violation of the Clean Water Act, we will be required to take extensive action to correct the problem and have been given a timeline to comply by 2013.

Over the past several years, the Village has upgraded and separated the older sewer system as funds become available for street reconstruction. According to the MWRD, Lemont's rate of wet weather flow exceeds 800 gallons per capita per day (gpcpd). The mandate from MWRD is to reduce this rate of wet weather flow to or below 150 gallons per capita per day (gpcpd). Penalties for failing to meet this rate of flow if Lemont is not proactive could be very expensive.

A complete evaluation of the overall sewer system is the first step in the process to arrive at a long-term control plan and involves televising and flow monitoring of both systems. Initial estimates indicate that this evaluation alone may cost about \$500,000. Once this information is compiled and assessed, we can only speculate on the cost of implementing the long-term plan. The bottom line is that this will be an expensive process at a time when Village revenues are least able to absorb the cost.

Village sewer rates are a flat \$15.00 per 2-month billing cycle per household/unit for residential sewer accounts. (\$7.50 per month) Commercial accounts are billed




Illustration: Sewer System - Wet Weather

\$15.00 per unit for the first 20,000 gallons and \$.25 for every 1,000 gallons thereafter. We have explored other avenues to fund this mandated sewer work, but find that an increase in the sewer rate is unavoidable.

Effective May 1, it is likely that the flat sewer rate for residential accounts may increase up to \$5 per month with a corresponding increase for the commercial users. Based on the information available now, we anticipate that this will be a one-time increase. To minimize the impact to seniors, a discount will beapplied. Once we have a better idea of the cost involved in implementing the long-term control plan and unknown m and at es

by IEPA and MWRD, we will provide more specific information. We hope to finalize this by the end of March. Please check the Village website periodically at www.lemont. il.us for updates.

The sewer increase will only partially fund this exhaustive and very costly process. The Village will continue to seek sources of funding for the remainder of the system upgrades that will inevitably have to take place.

# Landscape Waste and Branch Pick-up to Begin April 1

The landscape waste pick-up program will resume on April 1 and continue through the end of November. Yard waste will be collected on your regular trash pick-up day. To guarantee timely pick-up, landscape waste must be placed in a biodegradable paper landscape waste bag up to 33 gallons in capacity. LANDSCAPE WASTE IN CANS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.

Place landscape waste at the curb prior to 6:00 a.m.

A landscape waste sticker is required and may be purchased at the Village Hall, Lemont Township Office, Chipain's, Jewel Foods, Peterson's Hardware and Sears Hardware.

The cost per sticker is \$2.50.

## Branches/Brush

The annual branch/brush pick-up program will begin on April 1 and continue through the end of November. Branches and tree limbs will be picked up on the regular trash pick up day by Waste Management. A sticker is required for each bundle.
