## From the Mayor's Desk



### Warner Avenue Sewer Separation Moves Forward

We have been notified that state grant funding in the amount of \$450,000 for the Warner Avenue sewer separation project has been approved. We are grateful to our legislators for assisting us in securing these funds. The state has been agonizingly slow in releasing funds, but grants allocated for capital improvement projects are still in the state's budget. This infrastructure work is critical not only to the residents but to the Village's compliance in correcting the IEPA violations related to our sewer system's wet weather flows. We hope to take the project out to bid by October for a late fall start in this construction season if weather permits. The entire project will consist of replacement of water and sewer mains, separation of the combined sewer system into 2 systems, replacement of individual water services and repaving of portions of the street in the project area on Warner Avenue between Logan and Ridge Road and Eureka Street from Warner to State Street.

### Sewer System Violations

In July, the Village met with officials of the IEPA and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) regarding Lemont's and the MWRD's failure to provide adequate treatment to excess wet weather overflows. At this meeting, the MWRD outlined its proposed plan to increase the capacity of the influent sewer pipe from the Lemont combined sewer system to the treatment plan from 18" to 24" in conjunction with adding wet weather treatment capacity to the Lemont water reclamation facility by 2013. There are basically two discharge points where the overflows occur, so the Village has agreed to conduct additional monitoring and sampling at these locations for the next year, and for the year following the installation of the larger sewer pipe. Additionally, projects to separate our combined sewers will be undertaken as funding is available. The Village will continue its ongoing analysis of the separated system

for residential discharges from gutters or household pumps that are misdirected to the sewer. Residents can help by inspecting their particular discharges and correcting possible violations. We are hopeful that these measures will lead to full compliance with IEPA minimum standards for wet weather flow.

### Building Permits

Overall permit activity for the first two quarters of 2010 is lagging slightly behind this same period in 2009; however single family new construction permits total 17 which is 7 more than during the first two quarters of 2009, so that is encouraging news to report. Seven new businesses are preparing to open in the Village Square center along with several others around town. The renovation at Target is underway, and Englewood Construction is in the process of renovating the Totura building for its new corporate headquarters.

### 2010 Census Update

The final phase of the 2010 Census is underway, the quality assurance phase, which should last about 6 weeks. A small number of households will be re-contacted to verify the accuracy of the information collected. The census field representative will have the official census I.D. and census shoulder bag to identify them. Your cooperation, if contacted, is appreciated. We received a preliminary estimated population figure for Lemont of 16,265 which is about 400 residents short of the figure we received after the 2009 special census, so it will be interesting to see how the final number comes in for Lemont.

### I & M Canal Heritage Corridor Management Plan

In August, the Canal Corridor Association conducted a public meeting at the Village Hall to solicit public input on a comprehensive plan for the entire corridor. The Canal Corridor Association has been allocated \$10 million over 10 years to promote and improve the I & M Corridor. The meeting was very well attended by residents and stakeholders from various locations. If you were not able to attend the meeting, and this is an area of interest to you, the Canal Corridor Association has a blog on its website and invites your comments.

### Art & Culture Commission Grand Opening

Through the efforts of Trustee Ron Stapleton and the generosity of Brad Byarski, owner of Lemont Village Square, the Art & Culture Commission will be opening its new Lemont Center for the Arts to the public in September. All are invited to attend the day-long Grand Opening events on September 18 in Lemont Village Square Center at State and 127<sup>th</sup> Streets. This Commission has accomplished some great public art projects in Lemont and we look forward to its continued success in bringing an appreciation of the arts to the community.

The Village Treasurer, Jean Nona, will be retiring in October and has served as Lemont's chief finance officer for 25 plus years. She has diligently administered the finances of the Village, managed funds, budgeting and audits and is responsible for the the three awards we have received from the Government Finance Officers Association for excellence in financial reporting. The Board joins with me in thanking her for a job well done.

## Municipal Code On Line in September



The Village of Lemont recently completed the recodification of the Municipal Code. By mid-September the Code will be available electronically on the Village website at [www.lemont.il.us](http://www.lemont.il.us).

The Code is completely indexed, so residents can easily find the regulations on everything from Curfew to Parking to Building Codes to Noise Standards. The Unified Development Ordinance which regulates zoning is also completely contained within the document.

The Village Hall receives many calls from residents requesting information on ordinances. Having the Code available on line makes the information readily available in an easy to use format.

The Municipal Code is a work in progress and will be periodically revised to include new ordinances and refine the document as necessary.

## Annual Water Rate Increase Effective October 1

Beginning October 1, a slight increase in the water rates will become effective.

The rate for the first 4,000 gallons will increase from \$28.73 to \$29.59, and each additional thousand gallons will increase from \$5.70 per 1,000 gallons to \$5.81 per thousand.

**Senior Rates remain unchanged.**

These annual incremental increases are necessary to keep up with the costs to maintain and improve the Village's water system.



## ELECTION INFORMATION

In order to cast a ballot in the November 2, 2010 Election, voters must be registered by October 5. In this election, voters will elect a Governor and other state officials, U.S. and State Senators and Representatives, Cook County offices, and MWRD Commissioners. The special election to fill the remainder of the term for Sen. Obama's vacated Senate seat will be incorporated into the ballot. Residents may register in person during business hours at the following locations:

In order to register, you must be a United States citizen, at least 18 years old before the election and live in your election precinct at least 30 days before the election.

### Grace Period Registration and Voting October 6 through October 26:

Grace-period registration and voting is the only way to register or change your name or address after the regular registration period ends. It is also the only way to vote if you are not registered. For the November 2 elections, grace period registration and voting will be conducted at the Clerk's downtown office at 69 W. Washington Street, Room 500 and at 5 suburban mini-centers. Check for times. Grace period registrants will either vote on touch screen voting equipment immediately after registering or by absentee paper ballot. Grace period registrants are not eligible to vote at the polls on election day or take part in Early Voting.

**Early Voting:** Any registered voter may cast a ballot at one of the Clerk's early voting sites from **Monday, October 12 through Thursday, October 28** without specifying a reason or excuse. A photo I.D. is required. **Voters may vote early at Lemont Public Library, 50 E. Wend Street, M-F, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.** Call (630) 257-6541 for more information.

**Absentee Voting:** Applications for absentee ballots will be available at the Village Hall and Lemont Township beginning September 23, and must be postmarked no later than November 3. **Applications may also be downloaded from the Cook County Clerk's web site.** Residents of Lemont who plan to be absent from the county on November 2 may choose to cast an **in-person absentee ballot** between October 29 and November 1 at any of the County Clerk's downtown office and 5 suburban courthouse mini-centers.

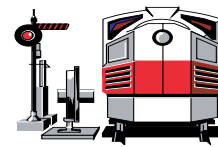

## Commuter Parking Permits On Sale October 2

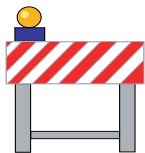

## Landscape Waste Pick-Up Ends November 26



Residents are reminded that the yard waste pick-up will end for the year on November 26 when the land-fill will close until spring. Wrap up those pruning and clean-up projects before this date.

The yard waste collection is **FREE** – no stickers required for Village residents for leaves and other yard debris if placed in a kraft paper yard waste bag and left at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your regular trash pick-up day.

Branches are also picked up as a free service **BUT** be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- **Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine.** (Branches in cans will not be accepted nor will unbundled branches.)
- **Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds.**

## Building Department

### Vacant Properties Must Register

Due to the increased numbers of foreclosed and abandoned properties, property owners and lending institutions are now required to register vacant properties with the Building Department.

A code inspection is now required for properties that have been vacant longer than 6 months before that property can be occupied again.

The purpose of these regulations is to prevent vandalism and monitor routine property maintenance. There is also an increased level of protection for new owners who may be unaware of plumbing or electrical systems that have possibly deteriorated during the vacancy.

### Grease Traps Require Inspection

State regulations already require commercial businesses and institutions where grease is generated from food preparation to have a grease interceptor within the plumbing system to prevent grease from entering the sewer system. A licensed professional hauler must remove the contents from the grease trap for proper disposal.

Because of recent sewer-related incidents, the Village has added this regulation to its Plumbing Code which will allow for local monitoring and periodic inspection of grease traps as required.

Restaurants and food preparation services are now required to have a log of regular maintenance of grease traps and recovery visits which can be physically inspected for compliance.
