Lemont Football Team Makes History

The Lemont High School football team reached the State Championship title game for the first time ever by defeating Oak Forest in the semi-finals on November 17th! The final story line in this historic season had not yet been written at the time this newsletter went to press. Regardless of the outcome of the State Championship (Class 6A) title game, these young men have made all of Lemont extremely proud. On behalf of the Village Board and the entire community, I would like to congratulate Head Coach Eric Michaelsen, his staff, and the team on their accomplishments. Congratulations are also due to the High School Board and the school administration.



Veterans Memorial Tollway Open for Business

On November 11, several thousand people attended the Grand Opening of the Veterans Memorial Tollway at the 127th Street interchange in Lemont. Over 5,000 bike riders and over 3,000 runners and walkers participated in the day's events.

If you haven't driven the new extension at this point, you are truly missing out on an amazing experience. As predicted, the traffic patterns thoughout Lemont have changed considerably since November 12. Only time will tell if the changes are permanent. However, the traffic on Lemont Road, McCarthy Road, and Route 83 during rush hour appears to be at least 50% less than previously measured.

New Police Station Moves Forward

A good deal of the Board's time during the past year has been devoted to discussion, review and evaluation of construction and financing for a new Police facility. To alleviate the

overcrowded conditions, the department is currently spread between 2 locations; administrative and office functions at the Main Street station, and the operations, investigative and emergency management functions at the former Public Works building on 127th Street. As a temporary solution, this arrangement is acceptable but it is not an effective way for the department to operate.



This spring, the Village will break ground at the Public Works site on 127th Street for a new 29,000 sq. ft. facility capable of housing the current Police Department with room for expansion. Wight & Company has designed the facility at a proposed construction cost of just over \$7 million, and will serve as construction manager for the project. Trustees Cliff Miklos and Brian Reaves served on the ad hoc committee, and the entire Board is in agreement that building this facility cannot be put off any longer.

The Board was determined not to seek a property or sales tax increase to finance the construction. Existing sales tax, utility tax revenues and delay of some of the other capital improvements in the 10 year capital budget, along with a new public safety impact fee assessed on new developments will provide the alternate revenue source for construction bonds.

Vacation of 127th Street between Smith Road and New Avenue.

The Village received notice in October from the DuPage Township Highway Commissioner that a request was being considered for the vacation of 127th Street between Smith Road and New Avenue. I attended the public hearing held on November 3 at the site, along with other officials and residents, to object to the vacation. The Village has approved a formal Resolution of Objection to the vacation and is discussing alternatives with Citgo. While we understand Citgo's security concerns, this connection to New Avenue is critical now that the interchange at 127th Street and I-355 is open.

Year in Review

Looking back over the past year at positive impacts to the community, nothing can top the opening of I-355 for the positive benefit of alleviating a great deal of the congestion on our local roads. Several commercial developments are taking shape and are bringing a variety of new and unique businesses to the village: Lemont Village Square, Derby Plaza, Front Street Lofts and Old Town Square. Capital Improvements during the past year included the annual street resurfacing program, and the major reconstruction of parts of East Street, Logan Street, Walnut Street and Moczygemba Street. The River Road-Front Street improvements are well underway and should be completed by next spring. An additional block of water main was replaced on Illinois Street, wrapping up a successful construction season. The Cook County project on 127th Street will extend into next spring, but 2-way traffic will now remain open for the duration of the project.

I would like to thank the citizens of Lemont for their support of this administration over the past year, especially on the billboard issue. Thanks are also due to those who faithfully serve on our advisory boards and commissions; their contributions are invaluable to the village. And finally, I would like to say a word of thanks to the Village Board members for their total dedication and commitment to this community of Lemont.

Village Applies For Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting

The Village has fulfilled all of the requirements of the Government Finance Officers Association, a body that establishes standards for public sector financial reporting, for the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. Achieving this certificate is a benchmark for excellence for state and local governments. GFOA standards are recognized nationwide and the certificate signifies superiority in budgetary and accounting practices.

The program requires that state and local governments exceed the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles in preparing comprehensive annual financial reports that provide for full disclosure to the public.

A Certificate is awarded only if the review committee determines that the governmental body seeking the Certificate of Achievement has fulfilled all of the requirements of the GFOA.

Congratulations to Trustee Brian Reaves, Finance Chair, and Village Treasurer Jean Nona on this achievement.

Snow Plowing Procedures

For efficient clearing of ice and snow, village streets, consisting of more than 120 lane miles, have been divided into 8 zones. Certain major streets have been designated as primary routes and are plowed and salted first: State Street and the bridge, Hillview Drive, Stephen Street, Main Street, school bus routes and the downtown area.

As soon as primary routes are cleared, the crews move on to secondary streets, paying special attention to streets with hills. After all streets are open for travel the trucks begin a curbing operation. The goal of the Public Works Department is to remove snow from all streets within six hours after the conclusion of a snowfall.

Salting

Salt is a key element of the snow fighting operation. Salt remains the most cost effective means of breaking the bond between ice and the street, especially with Lemont's unique topography. This operation is critical on curves, hills, bridges and intersections.

Damaged Property

Mailboxes in the Village right-ofway are sometimes damaged during snow removal. These will be replaced with a standard rural route mailbox in the spring. To report damage, call the Public Works Department at (630) 257-2532.



Winter Storms and Emergencies

If an emergency arises during a winter storm, residents should dial 911. All Public Works plowing vehicles maintain continuous two-way radio communication with the Police Department. Snow removal equipment can provide immediate support to ambulance and fire equipment.

From the Building Department . . .

Check Status of Building Permits and Find a Licensed Contractor On-Line

Residents may now check the status of building permits and find a Village-licensed contractor on-line.

Access the Village website at www.lemont.il.us and follow the link to the Building Department, or go directly to www.volbd.com.

Drop down lists of licensed contractors by type (general contractor, electrician, plumber, etc.) are available, or you can type in the name of a particular contractor to see if that contractor is currently licensed, bonded, and insured with the Village.

Homeowners and contractors can also now track the status of a particular permit from the menu.

In the near future, the Building Department will be posting specific requirements for various types of permits on this site. Application forms for many building permits are already available in the Download Directory at www.lemont.il.us.

Unified Development Ordinance in Final Draft

The Unified Development Ordinance combines current regulations on zoning, signs, historic preservation, subdivision and engineering specifications into one volume, making it easier for residents and developers to reference all provisions that might be pertinent to a particular project. The document is now in final draft form and will be ready for approval in December.

Citizen Police Academy Begins January 17

Registration Deadline December 14

The Lemont Police Department welcomes citizens interested in learning more about the law enforcement profession to attend its next Citizen Police Academy. The goal of this special training is to assist citizens in gaining an accurate understanding of police practices.

Six 2-hour training sessions will be offered on Thursday evenings from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. beginning January 17, 2008. There will be additional sessions for a graduation ceremony and optional field trips to Stateville Prison and the Bureau of Identification.

The class format will include practical demonstrations, hands-on exercises as permitted, and lecture by Lemont Police Department Command staff and patrol officers with expertise in specialized areas.

Have you ever wished you could attempt to find and lift a fingerprint, give a DUI field sobriety test, try on S.W.A.T. gear, or test your reactions in a shoot/don't shoot situation? This is your opportunity to find out.

Police Department Email Alert List

The Village of Lemont and Lemont Police Department are jointly developing an email alert system to communicate local emergency notices to residents. Notifications such as watering restrictions, road closures, weather emergencies, village events, crime alerts and other local issues will be sent via email to all who register. No names are needed, only email address and subdivision information. Residents who live in the central neighborhoods or downtown may identify their location by street name.

Email addresses will NOT be disseminated and will be used for this purpose only. Confidentiality will be maintained.

Police Department Urges Caution on 127th Street



Following the opening of the Tollway interchange at 127th Street, Cook County removed the stop signs on 127th Street at Timberline Drive. Motorists are urged to use caution when traveling this area. School zone and construction zone speed limits are still in effect and will be aggressively enforced by the Police Department. The 127th Street corridor is a major route for school and Park District activities.

Permanent intersection improvements are planned, but until the construction is complete or the stop signs are re-installed, please slow down and use caution.

Local Hearings for Municipal Code and Minor Vehicle Violations to Begin in January

Beginning in January, the Village will begin an administrative adjudication program for minor non-moving vehicle violations and code enforcement violations. This system will be much more convenient for residents than traveling to the Bridgeview Courthouse for these types of violations. Hearings will be held twice a month on Tuesdays at the Village Hall, and three attorneys have been contracted to serve as Hearing Officers. This program will have the added benefit of saving time and travel costs for Police Officers and staff who may have to attend the hearing.

Community Development Block Grant Funds Available

The Cook County Community Development Block Grant Program has funds available to correct code violations and replace roofs, furnaces, siding and windows for qualifying households that meet income guidelines. No monthly payments or interest. Homes will be liened for the full dollar amount of the rehabilitation and the funds are repaid only when the house is sold.
