From the Mayor's Desk

I-355 Tollway Update

By the end of August or very early September, 127th Street traffic will be diverted to the "runaround" or temporary roadway to allow for construction of the bridge at 127th Street. The next phase, constructing the bridge foundation, is expected to take several months.



On July 31, Mayors from the Tier II communities were invited to attend a meeting at the Lemont Village Hall to discuss the possibility of their contribution to the \$7.5 million cash local match required from the Tier I communities. Mayors or administrators from several nearby towns attended, and predictably, no one brought their checkbook. Bolingbrook offered the possibility of using some of the \$10 million they have already spent in improvements to make up a portion of the local match. It remains to be seen whether the Tollway will accept this proposal. It is unlikely that our cash contribution will be reduced.

Update on Downtown Redevelopment

As you all know, the Village has been negotiating a redevelopment agreement with Marquette Companies for Phase I of the downtown redevelopment project. In May of this year, the Village Board approved a redevelopment agreement but withheld signature until Marquette obtained all of the necessary financing to begin the project. This hurdle has finally been overcome. On August 14, the Board approved a contract with the low bidder for construction of underground utility improvements for River & Front Streets. The utility work will be coordinated with Commonwealth Edison. We expect that demolition of the existing building

at 340 River will occur as soon as permits are issued. Marquette intends to begin marketing efforts to attract commercial tenants for the retail spaces, and hopefully, some of that marketing will help fill some of the empty spaces downtown.

Construction is well underway on the Old Town Square development on Talcott Street. Preliminary approval has been given for a 20 townhome development at Talcott & Holmes Streets called Bella Strada. The Board recently approved an amendment to the Singer's Landing development, changing the original plan from 48 condominium units to 42 townhomes.

At the August Committee of the Whole meeting, a preliminary concept plan for the east gate area (Main Street directly east of downtown) was presented by Hitchcock Design Group. The study was commissioned by the Board to achieve a unified plan for development along this important entry corridor. A final document will be developed within the next few months.

Clean Indoor Air Ordinance

Most municipalities in suburban Cook County are involved in studying various Clean Indoor Air ordinances to aid them in drafting local smoking ban ordinances. Cook County municipalities that do not enact a local ordinance by March 31, 2007 will be required to abide by the county ordinance. Lemont is working with councils of government in Cook, Will and DuPage counties to draft a local ordinance for our community. So far our research indicates that most communities are approaching the issue from a regional standpoint. We will definitely take note of ordinances adopted by other communities, but will be certain to keep the best interests of our community at heart. We will keep you informed of our progress on this issue.

Community Development

The first round of changes to the zoning ordinance have been approved by the Board after a public hearing and several workshops. The Zoning Commission will now move on to other sections of the ordinance. Trustees Coules and Miklos along with the three other members of the commission have invested substantial time and effort into the first revision, and will continue to meet on the 2nd Monday of the month at 5:00 p.m. in the Village Hall to work on the revisions to the remaining sections. A public hearing will be scheduled before the next amendments are adopted. The zoning ordinance and revisions are posted on the website at www.lemont.il.us.

Recently submitted new commercial development plans include Derby Plaza, a proposed 15,000 sq. ft. retail-office development at McCarthy & Derby Roads and Lemont Retail Square, a multi-unit commercial building at 13941 S. Archer Avenue.

Construction Season Wraps Up

The 2006 Road Resurfacing Program and related public works projects are winding down. Portions of several roadways in Abbey Oaks and Castlewood Estates were re-surfaced. The Main Street culvert replacement, Central School fire supply main, Illinois Street water main replacement, and First Street sanitary sewer construction have been completed. The 131st Street utility extension is still in progress and is being coordinated with the county resurfacing project.

This fall, East Street will be constructed from Schultz Street to Short Street.

Volunteers are asked to wear long pants and long sleeves and bring a pair of gloves. Insect repellent is also a good idea. Scout groups, service organizations, and concerned citizens are encouraged to participate.

The Art and Culture Commission will host its Second Annual Fall Art Festival in historic downtown Lemont on Saturday, October 7th. From noon to 5:00 p.m., browse the market area where some of the region's finest arts and American crafts will be on display and available for purchase. Artists will be giving demonstrations in felting, weaving, carving, calligraphy and more throughout the day.

Food, refresments and a musical interlude will continue until the evening's 7:00 p.m. performance by **Zyngara**, a new world cirque featuring a theatrical kaleidoscope of sound, movement and costumes. Historic Preservation Commission to Hold Public Information Meeting September 21

The Lemont Historic Preservation Commission will hold a public information meeting on Thursday, September 21 at 6:30 p.m. in the Council Room at the Village Hall. Victoria Granacki of Granacki Historic Consultants of Chicago will be the featured guest.

Property owners in the Historic District are especially encouraged to attend, and those who pre-register by calling 630-257-1590 will receive a complimentary copy of the survey information for their building.

In 2005, each building and structure in the downtown Historic District and the 400 through 700 blocks of Singer Avenue were historically researched, photographically documented, and ranked as either significant, contributing or non-contributing to the district. The consultant will interpret the ranking and describe the research. A database has been provided with the survey data to allow for information to be updated in the future. Survey documents will be on display.

Awards will also be presented for excellence in preservation and buildings designated as landmarks.

The Historic Preservation Commission meets regularly on the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Village Hall. For more information on the Historic District or the public information meeting, call the Village Hall at (630) 257-1590.

Election Information

Voter Registration Closes October 10

In order to cast a ballot in the November 7 election, voters must be registered by October 10. Residents may register in person during business hours at the following locations:

Mail-in registration applications are available at all locations above. If you register by mail, the first time you vote must be in person. In order to register, you must be a United States citizen, at least 18 years old before the election and live in your election precinct at least 30 days before the election.

Grace Period Registration and Voting October 11 through October 24:

There is only one way and one place to register during the 14-day grace period. Unregistered voters must sign up to vote in person at the Clerk's downtown Chicago office at 69 W. Washington Street, Room 500.

Early Voting: Any registered voter may cast a ballot at one of the Clerk's early voting sites from Monday, October 16 through Thursday, November 2. For a complete listing of early voting sites, consult the County Clerk's web site or call the Village Hall at 630-257-1590.

Absentee Voting: Applications for absentee ballots will be available at the Village Hall and Lemont Township beginning September 28, and must be received in the County Clerk's Office no later than 5:00 p.m. on November 2. Applications may also be downloaded from the Cook County Clerk's web site. Voted ballots must be received by the County Clerk's Office by Election Day. Residents of Lemont who plan to be absent from the county on November 7 may choose to cast an in-person absentee ballot beginning October 16 at the Bridgeview Mini-Center, 10220 S. 76th Avenue in Bridgeview (708) 974-6150.

FREE Yard Waste Pick-up Begins October 17 and Continues through November 30

NO STICKER NEEDED

Beginning Tuesday, October 17 and continuing each week through November 30, Waste Management will pick up bagged yard waste as a free service to Village residents. **NO STICKER IS REQUIRED.**

Yard waste, including leaves, **must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags** (*leaves in cans will not be accepted*) and placed at the curb before 6:00 a.m. on your **regular trash pick-up day.**

FREE Branch Pick-up through November 30

The **FREE** Branch Pick-up Program will wind up for the year on November 30. Residents are reminded to complete pruning projects before that date. **Branches are picked up on your regular trash pick-up day.**

Be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine. (*Branches in cans will not be accepted.*)
- Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds.

NO STICKER IS REQUIRED FOR BRANCHES PROPERLY BUNDLED AND TIED.

Lawn Sprinkler System RPZ Valves Require Annual Testing

Lemont residents with lawn sprinkler systems are reminded that the RPZ (Reduced Pressure Zone) valves must be tested and certified annually and a report submitted to the Building Department. The annual report is required in accordance with the Illinois EPA and Illinois Department of Public Health code regulations to prevent possible contamination of the public water supply by faulty backflow prevention devices.

Testing must be completed by a certified Cross Connection Control Device Inspector. In most cases, the installer of the system is also qualified to inspect and test the valves. The Building Department maintains a list of certified inspectors which can be obtained by calling (630) 243-2733 or on the Village website at www.lemont.il.us.


