From the Mayor's Desk

Lemont to Receive Federal Transportation Funds

Congresswoman Judy Biggert paid a visit to the Village recently to announce some very good news for Lemont. Federal transportation funding has been approved for several projects in the Lemont area. An allocation of \$80,000 has been approved for engineering of the pedestrian bridge over the Sanitary & Ship Canal to connect the I & M Canal bikeway with the regional Centennial Trail. The Village will also receive \$280,000 for intersection improvements at McCarthy Road, Derby Road and Archer Avenue. This amount will cover engineering and some of the construction cost to modify the traffic signals and intersections, resurface, and improve street lighting at these 3 intersections. Cook County will receive \$360,000 for the 127th Street improvements, and \$713,600 has been allocated to complete the resurfacing of McCarthy Road from Bell Road to 86th Avenue in Palos Park.



Intergovernmental Grant Application

The Village, Lemont Park District and Lemont Township have jointly submitted a grant application to the Illinois Department of Transportation Enhancement Program seeking \$1,014,560 to develop 3.1 miles of bikeway improvements along the I-355 extension. Although there is stiff competition this year for these grant funds, we are hopeful that this project will receive serious consideration. An important link in the trail system could be accomplished along with the I-355 construction.

From the Mayor's Desk

Downtown Redevelopment Moves Forward

Over the past 3 months, a Downtown Zoning Ordinance was developed and approved after several public meetings and hearings. Public comment contributed to a final document which will dictate requirements for redevelopment and construction in the new TIF Redevelopment Area. Phase I, consisting of a 250 car parking deck surrounded by mixed use buildings with commercial space and about 80 residential units, is expected to break ground before the end of this year or in early Spring, 2006. Lemont has been a pioneer in the development of this ordinance; few if any communities in the state have attempted this kind of specialized zoning ordinance. The ordinance and renderings of Phase I are on the Village website at www.lemont.il.us.

Commercial Developments

Recently, plans were announced for Timberline Knolls, a high quality residential treatment center and school for adolescent girls and young women on the former Rock Creek Center site. It is expected that this facility may generate as many as 170 new jobs.

Rilly's Pointe, the retail development at McCarthy & Derby Roads, is under construction and is projected for completion by the end of the year.

2005 Road Construction Project Update

The Czacki Street reconstruction project is proceeding on schedule. Curb, sidewalks and a preliminary hard surface will be complete by September 1. The 127th Street project is somewhat behind schedule due to the utility relocation that must take place before sewer and water work can proceed. According to the most recent timetable, 2-way traffic should be restored by November. The Hermes Street reconstruction from Jayne to Peiffer should be substantially completed by the end of September. Details are falling into place for the I-355 extension. Work to be completed this fall includes embankment excavation, drainage work, and creating runarounds for bridges to be constructed in 2006 at various locations along the 12 mile extension.

Staff Changes

The Village is pleased to welcome a new Community Development Director, James Brown, who holds a master's degree in urban planning and public policy and has 16 years of experience in the military and in the private sector. The Community Development Department reviews all new developments, including the Downtown Redevelopment project, provides zoning and land use functions and supervises the Building Department. Jim will be working closely with the Village Board, the Plan Commission, and the Zoning Board of Appeals.

The Village Board consistently explores the most effective use of taxpayer dollars, including evaluation of each department's personnel needs. The Board concluded that outsourcing some of the building inspections would be equally efficient at a lower cost to the taxpayer. Over the past few years, the Board has combined departments and eliminated some staff positions without any reduction in services to our residents.

COMMISSION NOTES

Historic District Survey to Begin in September



Through a grant from the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency, the Historic Preservation Commission has received funding to conduct an intensive architectural survey of the historic district. After reviewing proposals, Granacki Historic Consultants of Chicago was retained to perform the survey.

Each building and structure in the downtown Historic District and the 400 through 700 blocks of Singer Avenue will be historically researched, photographically documented, and ranked as either significant, contributing or non-contributing to the district. The ranking will assist the Historic Preservation Commission and the Village Board in preserving the character of the Historic District and in responding to requests for alteration or demolition of existing buildings. A data base provided with the survey will allow for information to be updated in the future.

The survey will begin in early September and conclude by the end of the year. The boundaries of the Historic District are the Sanitary & Ship Canal on the North, Joliet Street on the West, Cass/Porter Street on the South and Holmes Street on the East. Four blocks of Singer Avenue are also within the Historic District. A portion of the Historic District is within the Downtown Redevelopment Area.

The Historic Preservation Commission meets on the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Village Hall.

Plan Commission begins Preliminary Work on Update of Comprehensive Plan

The Plan Commission has begun preliminary work on an update of the Comprehensive Plan. The plan was last updated in October, 2002.

The Comprehensive Plan serves as the master plan for the orderly development and growth of the Village and in the unincorporated territory within one and one-half miles of the Village boundaries. The plan establishes standards, reasonable planning and design requirements, designates land suitable for annexation and recommends zoning classifications for land within the Lemont planning area.

The Plan Commission will devote several workshops to an update of the Plan before conducting the required public hearing on a final draft document. The Plan Commission meets on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Village Hall.

Art & Culture Commission Hosts First Fall Art Festival October 1

The Art and Culture Commission will host its first Fall Art Festival to be held in downtown Lemont along the north bank of the I & M Canal on Saturday, October 1 from noon to 8:30 p.m. with a feature performance at 7:00 p.m. by **Zyngara**, an extraordinary theatrical kaleidoscope of sound, movement and costumes.



From noon until 5:00 p.m. a market area for fine arts and crafts will line the pathway to the **Zyngara** tent. Food, refreshments and a musical interlude will continue until the performance at 7:00 p.m.

Art demonstrations will be sponsored throughout the day by Artful Gatherings. Glass bead making, felting, weaving, pottery, fabric dyeing, and calligraphy will be demonstrated by respected artists in the field.

The Festival will raise funds for other Commission public art projects, including 12 additional mosaic pots for the downtown.

Advance tickets for Zyngara will be \$15.00 for adults, \$10.00 for children and seniors. What's New in the Village

Village to Install Automated Debit Card System at Metra Lot

Over the coming months, the Village will be working with Metra to streamline the existing daily fee payment system for commuters. The Village has entered into a contract with Total Parking Solutions, Inc. to install a Pay Station at the Metra Lot in place of the existing slot honor box system currently in use for daily fee parking. The new station would still accept cash & coins, but will also be set up to accept a debit card with a predetermined amount of time which can be purchased at the Metra Station. The commuter would simply swipe the card to deduct the daily fee. The improved system will be more convenient for commuters and require less staff time to monitor. The new system will be located in the same general area as the existing payment box. The daily parking fee will remain at \$1.00 per day.

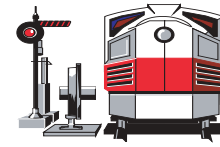
Links Heritage Quarries with Downtown

FREE Yard Waste Pick-up Begins October 18 and Continues through November 30

NO STICKER NEEDED

Beginning Tuesday, October 18 and continuing each week through November 30, Waste Management will pick up bagged yard waste as a free service to Village residents. **NO STICKER IS REQUIRED.**

Yard waste, including leaves, **must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags** (*leaves in cans will not be accepted*) and placed at the curb before 6:00 a.m. on your **regular trash pick-up day.**

FREE Branch Pick-up through November 30

The **FREE** Branch Pick-up Program will wind up for the year on November 30. Residents are reminded to complete pruning projects before that date. **Branches are picked up on your regular trash pick-up day.**

Be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- ¥ Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine. (*Branches in cans will not be accepted.*)
- ¥ Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds.

NO STICKER IS REQUIRED FOR BRANCHES PROPERLY BUNDLED AND TIED.

Community Development Block Grant Rehab Funds Available

You may be eligible to receive federal Community Development Block Grant funds for necessary home improvements and/or code upgrades. Home rehabilitation is available to qualifying homeowners with zero interest and no repayment until the home is sold or title is transferred. The Single Family Rehab program corrects all code violations, including: plumbing, electrical, roof replacement, siding and window replacement.

To qualify as an applicant:

- ¥ Household income must meet CDBG income guidelines.
- ¥ You must own and reside in the home.
- ¥ There must be sufficient equity to cover the amount of the repairs.

The home is liened for the full dollar amount of the rehabilitation. When the title transfers, the entire amount is paid back from the proceeds of the sale.

Police Briefs

Police Department Receives Award for Traffic Safety Program

In a competition called the "Law Enforcement Challenge," agencies across the United States submitted documentation of their efforts in DUI, speeding, and safety belt enforcement as well as their creative approaches to traffic management and public education.

Hundreds of agencies of all sizes and types submitted documentation of their traffic safety programs to this annual competition.

The Lemont Police Department has been awarded a first place finish in the National Competition and a second place finish in the State Competition.

The National Award will be

presented to Chief Kevin W. Shaughnessy at the annual International Association of Chiefs of Police Convention to be held in Miami, Florida in September, 2005.

Highlighted accomplishments include a 67% increase in DUI arrests; 85% increase in unlawful speed citations; and a 282% increase in occupant restraint citations.

Through aggressive and preventive traffic safety enforcement and public information and education efforts, the Lemont Police Department experienced a 27.5% decrease in alcohol-related traffic crashes and a 9% decrease in speed-related traffic crashes.

Child Passenger Protection Act

Children under the age of 8 years must be secured in an appropriate child safety seat.

Children weighing more than 40 pounds may be transported in the back seat while wearing only a lap belt, if the back seat is not equipped with a lap and shoulder belt system.

Children 8 - 16 years of age must be secured in a properly adjusted safety belt in any position in the vehicle.

The parent or legal guardian of a child under the age of 8 is responsible for providing a child safety seat to anyone who transports his or her child.

Every person under the age of 18 years who transports a child between the ages of 8 - 18 years is responsible for securing that child in a properly adjusted and fastened safety belt or child safety seat.
