Intergovernmental Summit

On May 26, the Village hosted an informal meeting of Lemont's governmental agencies to discuss future capital projects and goals of each taxing district. It's been more than a few years since these agencies had an opportunity to spend some time in open discussion of Lemont's future. The purpose of the get-together was to identify areas where there



may be some overlap and to see how we might be able to work together to get the best bang for the taxpayer's buck.

I am encouraged to say that the meeting went very well and the dialogue proved to be very interesting. We achieved our primary objective which was to identify opportunities in which the taxing bodies could leverage our resources with improved communication, cooperation, and coordination.

In the brief two and one-half hours that we were together, we identified several possibilities where two or more taxing bodies might be able to join forces on projects that would result in considerable savings to the taxpayers. As elected officials of the people, we are all very cognizant of the fiduciary responsibility we have to each and every citizen.

The next step that we intend to take is to appoint liaisons from each board to serve on a committee to identify specific projects and opportunities for intergovernmental collaboration. We will continue to keep the public apprised of our efforts and plans as we move forward.

CENSUS JOBSwill be AVAILABLE

Many community workers will be hired to conduct the special census. The Village will start recruiting workers approximately eight to twelve weeks prior to the designated starting date. Those who can work twenty hours a week are preferred. Census jobs are temporary in nature. Salaries range from \$9 to \$14 per hour depending on the position. Look for upcoming job advertisements in local newspapers, Channel 6, and the Village's website (www.lemont.il.us).

We're Counting on You to be Counted in the SPECIAL CENSUS

The 2000 census lists Lemont's population at 13,098. However, based on our estimates, the Village's population is already greater than 15,000. An accurate census matters because state aid sent to municipalities is based on a per capita formula of about \$102 per person. If Lemont has grown by 2,000 people since the 2000 census, which we believe it has, it will mean about \$204,000 more in yearly aid to the Village.

It is imperative that each household within the special census area participate in the process. By participating in the Special Census, you will ensure that your money comes back to our community to pay for the services that contribute to your quality of life.

The Special Census Questionnaire contains only six questions: name, household relationship, sex, date of birth and age, Hispanic or Latino origin, and race.

The special census will only be conducted in areas of new growth. However, because the counting is done by census block, some households that participated in the 2000 census will be counted again.

Generally, the special census will be conducted in areas including, but not limited to Abbey Oaks, Amberwood, Ashbury Woods, Covington Knolls, Eagle Ridge, Fire Rock Farm, Fordham Hills, Franciscan Village, Hirsekorn Ridge, Kensington Estates, Lemont Senior Housing, Mayfair Estates, Oak Tree, Rolling Meadows, and Ruffled Feathers.

Most likely, the census will begin in late summer or early fall.

Construction Season Underway

The 2004 Road Resurfacing Program slated for this spring will resurface and repair pavement on the following streets:

Kruk Street Schultz to Harasek Tomasezwski Street Schultz to Kruk

Harasek Street Schultz to McCarthy Street
River Street Bossert to Stephen Street

Resurfacing of the Talcott Street Parking Lot is also scheduled to begin.

Several drainage projects consisting of storm sewers and ditch work will begin in the following areas:

Crestview Drive East of Hillview

Coach Lane East of Carriage Ridge Lane

Eureka Drive North of Ridge Road Senon Drive East of Kromray Drive

K.A. Steel Road At the I & M Canal (culvert replacement)

Czacki Street At Schultz Street

The final touches to the downtown Stephen Street project will be added this spring with the installation of brick paver crosswalks at existing striped walks on Stephen Street from River Street to Main Street and at Lemont & Canal Streets.

Important Information

New Water & Sewer Rates

The Village Board has examined every alternative to finance construction of a new well, implement homeland security costs to safeguard the water supply, make necessary flood-related repairs and expand the Public Works facility. Although the Board was reluctant to consider a rate increase, it has become inevitable.

It has been 6 years since the last water rate increase and the sewer rate hasn't changed in 12 years. Every effort has been made to structure the increase to have no impact on seniors and very little impact on minimum users.

How do I apply for the Senior Discount Rate?

Seniors at age 65 may apply in person at the Village Hall for a discount on the water & sewer rates. The discount is available to senior homeowners who reside in the home and to senior tenants in metered units. To obtain the homeowner discount, the senior must provide proof of age, proof of ownership and proof of residency at the address. Senior tenants in individually metered units must provide proof of age, proof of tenancy, and proof of residency.



TIPS TO CONSERVE WATER

Face it. We all waste water. It's a fairly cheap commodity in plentiful supply. Using water wisely not only reduces the cost to the consumer, but it's good for the earth.

SAVING WATER OUTDOORS

- Use a broom, not a hose, to clean driveways and sidewalks.
- Water your lawn only when it needs it. A good way to see if your lawn needs watering is to step on the grass. If it springs back up when you move, it doesn't need water. If it stays flat, fetch the sprinkler.
- Water during the cool parts of the day. Early morning generally is better than dusk since it helps prevent growth of fungus.
- Don't water the gutter or the siding on the house. Position sprinklers so water lands on the lawn or garden, not on paved areas.

IN THE KITCHEN

- Use your diswasher only for full loads.
- If you wash dishes by hand, don't leave the water running for rinsing. If you have two sinks, fill one with soapy water and one with rinse water.
- Don't let the faucet run while you clean vegetables. Just rinse them in a stoppered sink or a pan of clean water.

IN THE BATHROOM

- Turn off the water after you wet your toothbrush. No need to keep water pouring down the drain. Just wet your brush and fill a glass to rinse.
- Rinse your razor in a stoppered sink instead of running water when you shave.
- Check faucets and pipes for leaks. Even the smallest drip can waste 20 or more gallons a day. Larger leaks can waste hundreds.

Public Works Department Completes Street Light Inventory

Now it is easier than ever for residents to report street light damage and outages, thanks to a new system developed by the Public Works Department. Over one thousand street lights have been inventoried and tagged with identification numbers. The tags are yellow and have been permanently affixed to the street side of the pole. The resident merely reads the number off the pole and calls the Public Works Department at 257-2532 to report the outage. With that information, the department can cross reference the pole to an address and retrieve information as to the type of pole (aluminum, concrete or wood) and the type and size of the bulb.

With this new system, if the pole is Village-owned, the Public Works Department can usually have the problem repaired within 24 hours. Some poles in the Village are owned and maintained by ComEd. Those outages generally take longer to repair but can be more promptly reported through the new I.D. system.

To report a street light outage, Call 257-2532 and give the number on the tag located on the street side of the pole about 5 feet from the ground in residential neighborhoods.



50/50 Sidewalk Replacement Program Underway

The Village of Lemont will pay 50% of the cost for complete or partial replacement of the public sidewalk in front of your home. To apply for the program, please contact the Public Works Department at 257-2532 Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The program is available annually. The cost per square foot is split equally between the homeowner and the Village. This is a great opportunity to repair deteriorated walkways.

Deadline for Tree Replacement and Sidewalk Programs is July 31.

50/50 Parkway Tree Replacement Program

The Public Works Department will again provide an opportunity for residents to replace dead or dying parkway trees. The Village will pay 50% of the cost of replacement, with the resident contributing the remaining 50%. Trees will be planted in the fall.

The program is for replacement of existing trees and is not intended for adding parkway trees in new subdivisions.
