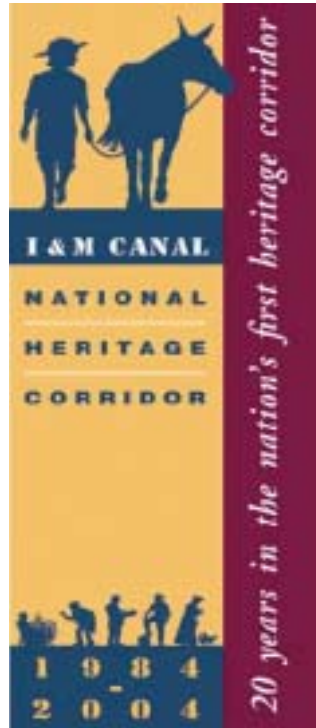

Lemont to Host I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor 20th Anniversary Exhibit

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the I & M Canal National Heritage Corridor, designated by Congress in 1984. In commemoration of the anniversary, a traveling exhibit consisting of 12 banners has been prepared by the Canal Corridor Association featuring conservation and preservation projects over the past 20 years along the I & M Canal corridor. The exhibit will be on display at the Village Hall from August 30 to September 16, Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Over the Labor Day weekend, from September 3 through September 7, the exhibit will be at the Lemont Historical Society, 306 Lemont Street, during regular museum hours. From the Mayor's Desk —

On August 16th, the Cook County Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing regarding Montalbano Builders' application for preliminary plat approval on the site formerly known as Leonas Farm. At this meeting, the builder announced that it was their intention to sell the property to another party that would develop the site and sell off the lots to multiple builders. There are still many issues to be resolved, such as drainage concerns, impact fees, and the fate of the Kettering house.

However, I think that we should all take comfort in the likelihood that there will be multiple custom home builders involved in this project, rather than a single production builder. The quality of the homes that are to be built was always a major point of contention with the residents in the area as well as the Village Board. I would like to thank our staff, the Village Board, and all concerned residents of Lemont Township for being diligent in our efforts to control the fate of this property.

We have also received confirmation from our legislators and the Illinois Department of Transportation that funding has been approved in the state budget for the resurfacing of Illinois Street and McCarthy Road. Both are state roadways and long overdue for repairs. McCarthy Road is slated for eventual reconstruction by IDOT, but that project is still several years away. The resurfacing will provide a much-needed temporary fix until reconstruction takes place. The repairs to both roads will be completed without a transfer of ownership to

the Village and we anticipate that the resurfacing will be scheduled in the Spring of 2005. I would like to publicly thank our legislators, Sen. Christine Radogno and Rep. Eileen Lyons for their assistance in securing the funding for the resurfacing.

The Village continues to promote dialog among intergovernmental agencies in an effort to improve communication and cooperation. The Board recently approved a request from the Fire District to receive a share of developer impact fees when new annexation agreements are negotiated. A similar arrangement was approved with the Library District last year after the court's decision that library districts could not impose impact fees. The Village will also waive permit fees for construction of the new fire station on Walker Road. This is a great example of the kind of intergovernmental cooperation we are trying to achieve for the good of the community.

I would like to put in a plug for the Special Census which will be administered in mid-October and urge everyone who receives a form or a visit from a census worker to complete the information and be counted.

Amazingly, it has been nearly 4 years since I took office in April of 2001. We have accomplished many important feats during the past several years and are well down the road to achieving the major goals and objectives set by our administration. We have accomplished much in a relatively short period of time but there is still much more to do.

SPECIAL CENSUS TO BEGIN THIS FALL

The 2000 special census lists Lemont's population at 13,098. However, based on our estimates, the Village's population is already greater than 15,000. An accurate census matters because state aid sent to municipalities is based on a per capita formula of about \$102 per person. If the Village has grown by 2,000 people since the 2000 census, which we believe it has, it will mean about \$204,000 more in yearly aid to the Village.

It is very important that each household within the special census area participate in the process. The Special Census questionnaire contains only six questions: name, household relationship, sex, date of birth and age, Hispanic or Latino origin, and race. By participating in the Special Census, you will ensure that your tax money is used in your community for services that contribute to your quality of life.

The special census will only be conducted in areas of new growth. However, because the counting is done by census block, some households that participated in the 2000 census may be counted again. Generally, the special census will be conducted in areas including, but not limited to:

Residents in these subdivisions who are being counted in the census are urged to complete and return the questionnaire when it is received and respond to census workers who may visit their home.

The Village has already filed the necessary paperwork with the Census Bureau and is working to establish a starting date. Tentatively, the census will be conducted over an approximately 3-week period starting in late October.

Census Workers Needed



Many community workers will be needed to conduct the special census. The Village will start recruiting workers shortly. Residents who have already expressed interest in working for the census will be contacted directly. Those who can work 20 hours a week are preferred.

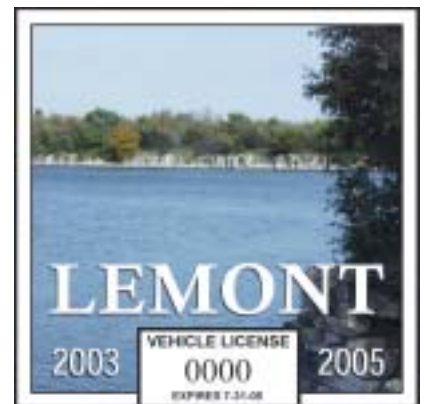
Census jobs are temporary in nature. Salaries range from \$9.00 to \$14.00 per hour depending on the position. Look for upcoming job advertisements in local newspapers, Channel 6, and the Village's website (www.lemont.il.us).

VEHICLE STICKERS REQUIRED FOR VILLAGE RESIDENTS

Residents are reminded that a valid vehicle sticker is required for any auto registered to a Village address, and must be affixed to the lower portion of the windshield on the passenger side. This regulation will be strictly enforced. Violators will be charged a \$25.00 fine in addition to the cost of the vehicle sticker.

New residents have 30 days to purchase a vehicle sticker. Application forms are available at the Village Hall and may be obtained by stopping in or calling 630-257-1550 to receive an application in the mail. Business hours at the Village Hall are 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Saturday.

A transfer sticker is available at \$3.00 to replace a valid sticker when a new automobile is purchased. Residents have 30 days to obtain a replacement sticker. For complete information, contact the Finance Department at 630-257-1550.

Water Rate Increase Effective October 1

As previously reported, in order to finance construction of several capital improvements including a new well (\$2,440,000), required homeland security improvements to safeguard the water supply (\$100,000), several flood mitigation projects (\$484,000), retirement of an existing recapture agreement (\$500,000) and re-location of the public works facility (estimated at \$3 million), a water rate increase has become inevitable. The last water rate increase was in January, 1998, over six years ago. Every effort has been made to structure the increase to have no impact on seniors and very little impact on minimum users.

An evaluation of water revenues revealed that our water distribution has been largely subsidized by tap-on fees despite the escalating costs of day-to-day operations. In other words, the water distribution system is not taking in sufficient revenue to pay its expenses. Additional minimal increases will be necessary over the next few years to make the system self-sufficient and pay the debt service for a bond issue to finance the necessary water sytem capital improvements.

On October 1, all account numbers starting with 001 will receive their regular bill for August and September at the old water rate. All account numbers starting with 002 will receive a water bill at the old water rate for September only. On November 1, the 002 accounts will receive a bill at the new rate for October only. Thereafter, all accounts will be billed on the 2-month cycle at the new rates.

Well #6 Drilling in Progress



When completed, Well #6 will have the capacity to pump 1,000 gallons of water per minute. Well #6, combined with the other Village wells, will help meet community water needs through 2010.

How to Apply for the Senior Discount Rate

Seniors at age 65 may apply in person at the Village Hall for a discount on their water & sewer rates. The discount is available to senior homeowners who reside in the home and to senior tenants in metered units. To obtain the homeowner discount, the senior must provide proof of age, proof of ownership and proof of residency at the address. Senior tenants in individually metered units must provide proof of age, proof of tenancy, and proof of residency.



More Water Conservation Tips

As part of your fall home maintenance program, check water fixtures, including outdoor spigots and faucets. A dripping faucet or fixture can waste 3 gallons of water a day, a total of 1,095 gallons per year.

According to data provided by Sensus Technologies, a continuous leak from a 1/16" diameter hole in a water pipe could waste as much as 74,000 gallons in a 3-month period. Be sure to repair any leaks.

Get in the habit of using water wisely. Conserving water whenever possible not only will reduce your water bill, it's good for the earth.

FREE Yard Waste Pick-up Begins October 19 and Continues through November 30

NO STICKER NEEDED

Beginning Tuesday, October 19 and continuing each week through November 30, Waste Management will pick up bagged yard waste as a free service to Village residents. **NO STICKER IS REQUIRED.**

Yard waste, including leaves, **must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags** (*leaves in cans will not be accepted*) and placed at the curb before 6:00 a.m. on your **regular trash pick-up day**.

FREE Branch Pick-up through November 30

The **FREE** Branch Pick-up Program will wind up for the year on November 30. Residents are reminded to complete pruning projects before that date. **Branches are picked up on your regular trash pick-up day.**

Be sure to observe the requirements for branch pick-up:

- Branches must be bundled and tied with biodegradable string or twine. (*Branches in cans will not be accepted.*)
- Branches must be less than 4 feet in length, less than 4 inches in diameter and weigh less than 50 pounds.

NO STICKER IS REQUIRED FOR BRANCHES PROPERLY BUNDLED AND TIED.

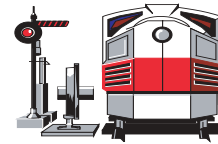
