

From the Mayor's Desk

Village Moves Another Step Closer To Heritage Quarries Park

Phase I to be Ready by End of Summer

Recent successful negotiations by the Village with K.A. Steel Chemicals and I.M.T.T. have resulted in obtaining lease agreements for Ice Box Quarry and sufficient additional acreage to develop Phase I of the Heritage Quarries Park Master Plan by the end of this summer.



The north side of the I & M Canal path has already been cleared, surfaced, extended west to I.M.T.T. and looped around the Great Lakes Quarries by volunteers and the Village Public Works Department.

The remaining grant funds, approved three years ago by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, will be used to construct a parking area this spring on the south side of the I & M Canal, just west of Ice Box Quarry, and to extend the path on the south side of the Canal to I.M.T.T. Funds have also been requested to construct two pedestrian bridges over the I & M Canal, one near Amato's Quarry and an additional crossing point near I.M.T.T., also to be constructed this spring. Contingent upon construction cost, a third footbridge near the waterfall has been designed and may also be constructed.

ELECTION SIGNS

Political campaign signs must be located on private property and may not exceed 16 square feet in area. Signs may be erected not more than 30 days before the election and must be removed within 3 days after the election. No signs are permitted in the public right of way.



Be Prepared for Severe Weather

Spring weather fluctuations can often cause severe storms and weather conditions Know the terms:

STORM WATCH

Severe storms or tornadoes are possible. Watch the sky and listen to radio or T.V. for more information. Be prepared to take shelter.

STORM WARNING

A tornado has been sighted or severe weather is imminent as indicated by weather radar. Take shelter. Tornado Awareness Week March 3 - 8

Lemont Declared a Storm Ready Community

The National Weather Service has declared Lemont a Storm Ready Community. Lemont Emergency Management personnel, led by Coordinator Tom Ballard, have participated in a grant program to install weather monitoring radios in all Lemont schools and public buildings, and have provided a community education program for storm preparedness.

LEMA personnel have also been trained in spotting and reporting techniques for severe weather conditions. According to the National Weather Service, Lemont has a prototype severe weather preparedness program.

EMERGENCY WARNING SIREN

The tornado warning siren will sound if a tornado or funnel cloud aloft is reported within a ten-mile radius based from the center of Lemont or any time the National Weather Service advises a warning which will impact the Village or Township, and when wind gusts are clocked in excess of 50 m.p.h. **No All-Clear Siren will be activated.**

Severe Weather Tips

Determine the best location in your home and office to seek shelter when threatened by severe weather. A basement or cellar will usually afford the best protection. If an undergroud shelter is not available, identify an interior room or hallway on the lowest level. Conduct periodic safety drills with your family.

Observe these safety precautions in the event of severe weather:

- Stay away from windows.
- Get out of automobiles.
- If caught outside or in a vehicle, lie flat in a nearby ditch or depression.
- Keep a battery-powered radio available for weather updates.

Landscape Waste Pick-up to Begin April 1

The landscape waste pick-up program will resume on April 1 and continue through the end of November. Yard waste will be collected on your regular trash pick-up day. To guarantee timely pick-up, landscape waste must be placed in a biodegradable paper landscape waste bag up to 33 gallons in capacity. LANDSCAPE WASTE IN CANS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.

Place landscape waste at the curb prior to 6:00 a.m.

Landscape Waste Sticker Required

Stickers may be purchased at the Village Hall, Lemont Township Office, Chipain's, Jewel Foods, Peterson's Hardware, Sears Hardware, and Totura's. The cost per sticker is \$2.00.

Paper landscape waste bags may be purchased at the Village Hall at \$.30 each or at local grocery and hardware stores.



Branch Pick-up Program Begins April 1

The annual branch/brush pick-up program will begin on April 1 and continue through the end of November. Branches and tree limbs will be picked up on the regular trash pick up day by Waste Management.

BRANCHES MUST BE TIED:

- less than 4 feet in length.
- less than 4 inches in diameter.
- less than 50 pounds.
- tied with biodegradable string/ twine (no wire)

BRANCHES IN CANS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.

NO LANDSCAPE STICKER IS REQUIRED FOR BRANCHES. THIS IS A FREE SERVICE.



FREE Landscape Waste Spring Clean-up

April 22, 23, & 24

NO STICKER REQUIRED

A special FREE Spring Yard Waste Pick-up provided by the Village of Lemont and Waste Management has been scheduled on the REGULAR TRASH PICK-UP DAY during the week of April 21. This is your opportunity to get rid of all the leaves and debris which may have accumulated over the winter.

NO STICKERS REQUIRED THIS WEEK ONLY

Yard waste must be bagged in paper landscape waste bags to be picked up.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT REHAB FUNDS AVAILABLE

You may be eligible to receive Community Development Block Grant Funds for necessary home improvements. Home rehabilitation is available to qualifying homeowners with zero interest and no repayment until the home is sold or title is transferred. The Single Family Rehab program corrects all code violations, including: plumbing, electrical, roof replacement, siding, and window replacement.

To qualify as an applicant:

- Household income must meet CDBG income guidelines.
- You must own and reside in the home.
- There must be sufficient equity to cover the amount of the repairs.
