From the Mayor's Desk-

Waste Hauling Contract Changes on the Horizon

Effective May 1, Village residents will have a new hauler for trash removal, landscape waste pickup, and recyclable collection.

As we approached the end of the franchise agreement with Citiwaste, it became very apparent that the Village would be hit with a significant increase in rates for residential waste removal. Attempts to negotiate a better rate with Citiwaste were unsuccessful.



Several options were explored by the Board and staff, and we believe that we have arrived at the best deal for Lemont with Waste Management. Before arriving at an agreement, we also examined waste removal rates in nearby towns, and found that our current rate is very low in comparison to other communities. We have been told that the rate increase is industry-wide and due to the increased costs assessed to haulers and lack of nearby landfill space.

Since 90% of Lemont residents use the "express" or take-all service, this will be the only option available in the new contract. A benefit of the take-all service is that residents will have the opportunity to dispose of one large or bulk item per week with this plan (excluding construcion material, white goods, tires and household hazardous wastes, which require a special pick-up). Residents will also have the option to rent a 96 gallon cart or a yard waste cart if desired.

Waste Removal Contract (cont'd)

The Recycling Pick-up will remain unchanged, and will continue to be picked up on the same day as trash. Bins will be provided by Waste Management.

The Landscape Waste program provides for unlimited pick-up of yard waste from April 1 through November 30 with a \$2.00 sticker for each 30 gallon Kraft bag. Although this is a slight increase in the sticker fee, residents have not had a rate increase for stickers since 1998.

Seniors will continue to receive a \$1.00 monthly discount, and quarterly billing will be directly handled by the hauler.

Waste Management will contact each resident directly regarding the pick-up schedule and specific information regarding the trash removal, recycling and landscape waste programs.

There may be a period of adjustment, as there would be with any change of provider, but I am confident that residents will be pleased with the service provided by Waste Management.

Non-partisan Ballots will be Available

In order to make precincts more uniform in size and number of registered voters, the Cook County Election Department has made some revisions to the Lemont precinct map.

Some residents who formerly voted in Precinct 11 (Centennial Recreation Center), will now vote

in Precinct 7 (Lemont United Methodist Church). Some residents who formerly voted in Precincts 9 and 13 (Centennial Recreation Center), will now vote in Precinct 15 (Centennial Recreation Center). Affected voters should have received new voter registration cards with the correct precinct number. For this Primary Election, registered voters may request a non-partisan ballot which will contain only the referenda questions. No candidates for elected office will appear on this ballot.

Applications for absentee ballots are available at the Village Hall and at Lemont Township. Applications must be received by the County Clerk's Office no later than Thursday, March 14. Applications may be taken to Bridgeview Mini Center, 10220 S. 76th Avenue in Bridgeview for in-house absentee voting, beginning February 25.

Transportation 500 Committee **Develops Procedures For Traffic Issues**



Due to the increasing number of neighborhood and village-wide traffic issues, an Ad Hoc Transportation Committee, consisting of Village Board members and staff, has completed a draft procedure for evaluating and responding to trafficrelated requests and complaints.

This procedure provides a uniform, step-by-step process for residents and Village staff for handling all traffic problems from parking restrictions through neighborhood-wide traffic calming. Requests or complaints regarding changes to existing traffic control conditions must be submitted in writing to the Village. All requests will be initially evaluated by the Engineering and Police Departments. Depending on the nature of each request, it may be processed by Village staff or referred to the Transportation Committee.

Requests may proceed through four levels of evaluation: Level 1 consists primarily of data collection (traffic counts if necessary) and the education of the process to be taken by the application. Levels 2 and 3 consist of actions that may be taken by Village staff or the Village Board depending on whether actual policy or Ordinance changes are required (for example: new stop signs).

Members of the public, through neighborhood representatives, will also serve on the Committee once a neighborhood's application process achieves Level 4, Traffic Calming. This level of traffic control may involve physical changes to the roads within the neighborhood. Public meetings will be held t this level, with the residents, the Transportation Committee and the Village Board.
