COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING APRIL 21, 2014

A Meeting of the Village of Lemont Committee of the Whole was held on Monday, April 21, 2014 in the Lemont Village Hall Board Room at 418 Main Street, Lemont, Illinois.

- **I. CALL TO ORDER** Mayor Reaves called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- **II. ROLL CALL** Trustees Debby Blatzer, Paul Chialdikas, Cliff Miklos, Rick Sniegowski, Ron Stapleton and Jeanette Virgilio were present.

Also present were Village staff members George Schafer, Martha Glas, Charity Jones, Mark LaChappell, Linda Molitor, Ralph Pukula, Kevin Shaughnessy and Chris Smith.

III. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. 931 Singer Ave. Variation

A variation is being requested to allow a proposed detached garage to be accessed from the street as opposed to the alley as required in the R-4A district by code. The currently vacant property is a corner lot in which a home and detached garage will be constructed on the property. The applicant is requesting access to the garage off of Peiffer Ave. The Village Board was in agreement with recommending approval.

B. Birch Path PUD & Annexation and Rezoning Discussion

The developer of Birch Path previously requested a preliminary PUD plan for approval, and discussions with PZC and COW were previously held. A PZC Public Hearing was held on November 20, 2013. The Planning & Zoning Commission added supplemental conditions to the plan, but did not recommend approval. At the December 16, 2013 Committee of the Whole Meeting, discussion continued on the concerns, and outstanding items in which the PUD will not be approved until these items are addressed to the satisfaction of the Village Board.

At this April 21 COW Meeting, staff reviewed the Case History Summary noting the outstanding items from 12/16/13, and discussed the Current Status; each of which is included in the 4/21/14 agenda report. The petitioner submitted a revised site plan with preliminary engineer noting the changes/recommendations. Discussion took place regarding the items which will again be incorporated into the site plan. The PUD will be up for preliminary plat approval at a future Village Board Meeting.

C. Refunding General Obligation Bonds Series 2005 (Sales Tax ARS) and Series 2012B Gateway TIF Discussion

The General Obligation Bonds Series 2005 are callable on September 1, 2014. Bob Vail of Bernardi Securities presented the refinancing and restructuring summaries indicating an estimated savings of \$55,470.00. The 2012B Gateway TIF bonds need to be restructured to match the TIF increment and the marketability of the acquired properties for a \$4,135 savings. The Village Board was in agreement of the refunding and restructuring of the bonds.

D. Eagle Crest Parking

A pilot restricted parking was done last year on the east side of Eagle Crest and it was successful. It is staff's recommendation to make this one side parking permanent during the months of May 1 through October 1 in which parking will be permitted only on the west side of Eagle Crest. The Board suggested that due to the extended activities at the Park District to make it the months of May 1 – November 1. The item will be approved at a future Village Board Meeting.

E. Canal Lease Process

There are four properties which reside on a portion of the canal area which the village leases to. Kallemeyn Collission has a lease that is issued through 2018. Staff would like to make the remaining three leases to be issued through 2018 as well. In addition, staff intends to reassess the amount billed per square foot. The Village Board would like to leave the remaining leases as an annual lease agreement.

F. Channel 6 Program and Vehicle Donation

The Fire Department offered to donate a vehicle to use for a production van. Discussion took place on the feasibility of utilizing this vehicle, but was determined that the Village would not be able to utilize it at this time due to the size, cost to convert it and driver license class limitations.

V. NEW BUSINESS

A. MI Homes

Residential design considerations at Kettering were discussed. They intend to sell off larger lots to other builders.

B. Pension Board

The Board was informed that the Pension Board adopted/revised their investment policy.

C. Emerald Ash Trees

Public Works will determine the priority of those infested trees. The trees need to bud first, so the timing will be at the end of May. Residents can contact the Public Works department to inform them of infested trees which Public Works will then log and monitor. Residents can plant their own trees, but the type would need to be approved.

D. Logan Street Parking

Residents have complained about the two-sided parking on Logan Street. It is the only street around the church that allows two-sided parking.

E. Sports Complex

We are waiting on MWRD regarding direction for cleanup of the property. Mesirow is running the numbers based on the scope of the project.

F. I&M Canal Wall

Public Works and Engineering will talk to some engineers regarding repair of a portion of the I&M Canal wall.

An Ordinance Amending Title 10 of the Lemont, Illinois Municipal Code Relating to Parking

WHEREAS, the Village of Lemont ("Village") is an Illinois Municipal Corporation pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Statutes of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village has in the past restricted parking along Eagle Crest Drive adjacent to the Centennial Outdoor Aquatic Center on a temporary basis; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the public health, safety and welfare to implement permanent parking restrictions along Eagle Crest Drive and to make certain other changes to the parking restrictions in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees desire to amend Sections 10.16.050 and 10.16.061 of the Lemont, Illinois Municipal Code ("Village Code") to reflect these changes in the manner set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT and BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEMONT, COOK, DUPAGE AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: The statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

SECTION 2: The Village Code, as amended, is hereby further amended in Title 10, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, by amending Section 10.16.050 No Parking Areas Designated, by striking subparagraph (9) in its entirety and replacing it with a new subparagraph (9) so that the same shall be read as follows:

(9) Eagle Crest Drive, eastside, from W. 127th Street to W. Deer Lane, from May 1st through and including October 1st of each calendar year.

SECTION 3: The Village Code, as amended, is hereby further amended in Title 10, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, by striking Section 10.16.061 Resident Parking in its entirety.

SECTION 4: Appropriate signs shall be erected informing the public that parking is prohibited as provided herein.





FINDINGS. Based upon the evidence and testimony presented in the public hearing, the Planning & Zoning Commission finds the following:

- The variation is consistent with general purpose and intent of the Unified Development Ordinance in that it will not have a negative impact on surrounding properties, or the Village in general. The subject lot is a vacant corner lot and the new home is proposed to face Singer Ave. The driveway will not exit onto Singer Ave. and will therefore not negatively impact the Singer Ave. Block face.
- 2. A majority of homes along the north side of Peiffer Ave. have driveways that exit onto Peiffer Ave. Therefore, the proposed driveway access will not negatively impact the Peiffer Ave. block face.
- 3. The property has a utility pole and guy wire on the east lot line adjacent to the alley. The location of the pole and wire limits driveway access from the alley and makes access from this area impractical and creates a hardship for the owner.

STANDARD BARRIER AND DEPRESSED CURB AND GUTTER



WHEREAS, the Village of Lemont ("Village") is an Illinois Municipal Corporation pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Statutes of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees desire to amend a certain provision of the Lemont, Illinois Municipal Code ("Village Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Village finds that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend Section 1.16.010 of the Village Code in the manner set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT and BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEMONT, COOK, DUPAGE AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: The statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.

SECTION 2: The Village Code, as amended, is hereby further amended in Title 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS, by amending Section 1.16.010 General Penalty, by adding a new subsection (g) so that the same shall be read as follows:

(g) That prior to the issuance of any license, certificate and/or permit required pursuant to the laws and ordinances of the Village of Lemont, the Village Clerk, or his/her duly designated agent, shall ascertain that there are no unpaid charges for water service, other municipal services or any other municipal fees, fines, judgments, levies or debts then due and unpaid. No such license, certificate or permit shall be approved or issued until such time as the applicant presents to the appropriate department a certificate of the Village Clerk, or his/her duly designated agent, indicating that all charges, fees, assessments, fines, judgments, levies or debts, owed to the Village have been paid in full.

SECTION 3: The Village Code, as amended, is hereby further amended in Title 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS, by adding a new Chapter 1.18 and new Section 1.18.010 entitled "Late Fees," so that the same shall be read as follows:

Section 1.18.010

Any fee, fine, charge, cost or other expense not paid within thirty (30) days of the date due shall be assessed a late fee in the amount of \$50.00. The late fee shall be in addition to the original amount owed.

SECTION 4: The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and should any provision of this Ordinance be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

SECTION 5: That the Village Clerk of the Village of Lemont be and is directed hereby to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, made and provided.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

License Agreement

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement ("Agreement") is made as of this ____ day of _______, 2014 ("Effective Date"), by and between Village of Lemont, an Illinois municipal corporation ("Village") and INTEGRITY SECURITY PERSONNEL CONCEAL CARRY, INC., an Illinois corporation ("Licensee"). Village and Licensee are hereinafter sometimes referred to individually as a "Party" and together as the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Village is the owner of a certain facility commonly referred to as the Lemont Police Department, located at 14600 127th Street, Lemont, IL 60439 (the "**Property**");

WHEREAS, Licensee is an Illinois corporation that provides firearm and concealed carry training, education, and instruction to Village residents and the general public;

WHEREAS, Licensee desires to use portions of the Property, specifically including the shooting range, to conduct training, educational, and instructional classes on concealed carry and firearms safety for Village residents and the general public (collectively, the "Licensed Activities"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that this Agreement will help promote firearm safety and education; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that this Agreement is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises hereinafter set forth, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Agreement, and made a part hereof, and all covenants, terms, conditions and provisions hereinafter contained shall be interpreted and construed in accordance therewith.
- 2. <u>Non-Exclusive License</u>. Village hereby grants to Licensee a non-exclusive license ("License"), subject to the terms, covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, to use and have reasonable access and means of ingress and egress to, from, over, upon, and across the Village of Lemont Police Department's shooting range (the "Licensed Space"), as identified and depicted on the site map attached hereto as Exhibit A, for the sole and limited purpose of conducting the Licensed Activities. The Village also hereby grants its permission to Licensee, for the purposes of the Licensed Activities, to use in common with others and on a non-exclusive basis, all other areas located in and about the Property which are used by the public generally including parking areas (the "Common Areas"), for a term as set forth herein, unless sooner terminated as provided elsewhere in this Agreement. The Village reserves the right, but shall be under no obligation, to enter upon the Licensed Space at any time(s) to inspect them for

compliance by Licensee with the provisions of this Agreement, to make such repairs as it shall deem necessary or advisable, and for all other lawful reasons.

- 3. <u>Term.</u> Subject to extension or termination as provided in this paragraph or paragraph 12 below, the term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one (1) year from the Effective Date of this Agreement ("Initial Term"), and shall thereafter automatically renew on an annual basis for successive one-year periods on the anniversary of the Effective Date (each one-year period shall be referred to as the "Renewal Term"), unless either Party notifies the other Party in writing, at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or any Renewal Term, of its intention not to renew the Agreement. The Initial Term together with any Renewal Term, if and when it occurs, shall be referred to as the "Term."
- 4. <u>License Fee</u>. In consideration of the License granted Licensee under this Agreement, Licensee shall pay a fee to Village in the amount of twenty dollars (\$20.00) for each student enrolled in any class or program offered by Licensee in connection with the Licensed Activities in the Licensed Space ("**License Fee**"). The Licensee Fee shall be paid on a monthly basis, shall include payment for each student enrolled by Licensee in the Licensed Activities during the month for which payment is being made, and shall be paid not later than the fifth (5th) day of the month immediately following the month for which payment is being made. Licensee shall track student enrollment in the Licensed Activities and shall maintain accurate records of same. Licensee shall provide this information in a written accounting to the Village, together with the payment of the License Fee to which the records relate, in order to allow the Village to confirm the amount of the License Fee. Licensee shall provide the Village Administrator or his designee.

If Licensee is delinquent in any payment by more than ten (10) days past the date for payment specified above, a notice will be sent to Licensee at the address set forth in this Agreement ("Notice of Non-Payment"). If Licensee does not satisfy any delinquent payment within five (5) days after receipt of the Notice of Non-Payment, the Village shall have the option to terminate this Agreement immediately upon notice to Licensee.

Space for the purposes of the Licensed Activities on the dates and at the times specified in Exhibit B attached to and incorporated in this Agreement. Village reserves the right to use, or permit third parties to use, the Licensed Space at any time or times when not in use by Licensee pursuant to the schedule set forth in Exhibit B. Any rights to the Licensed Space not specifically granted to Licensee under this Agreement are reserved to Village, its successors and assigns. Any requests for alterations of the set schedule must be in writing to the Village prior to Licensee committing to the use of the Licensed Space. Licensee must receive prior approval from Village prior to scheduling any Licensed Activities on dates/times not identified on Exhibit B. Exhibit B may be modified in writing by agreement of Licensee and Village. The Parties acknowledge that Licensee may decide to cancel a scheduled use of the Licensed Space. In that event, it is essential that the Licensed Space be available for use by the Village or other persons.

Accordingly, Licensee shall inform Village immediately if it will not be using the Licensed Space on any of the dates/times scheduled for Licensee's use.

6. <u>No Representations and Warranties</u>. The Village shall not, and by virtue of this Agreement and the License granted hereunder does not, sanction, endorse, or promote Licensee or the Licensed Activities in any manner whatsoever. The Village makes no representations, guarantees, or warranties, expressed or implied, as to the accuracy, completeness, content, currency, and suitability of Licensee or the Licensed Activities. The Village specifically disclaims any and all liability for any claims or damages that may result from Licensee's acts or omissions in its performance of the Licensed Activities.

7. <u>Condition of the Licensed Space; Duty of Care.</u>

- A. Licensee (i) has examined the Licensed Space prior to execution of this Agreement and is satisfied with its condition; (ii) acknowledges that no representation as to the condition or repair thereof has been made by the Village other than as expressly contained in this Agreement; (iii) acknowledges that no agreement or promise to alter, repair or improve the Licensed Space, other than as expressly contained in this Agreement, has been made by the Village; and (iv) agrees to return to the Licensed Space to Village, in a condition as good or better then when first used by Licensee, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- B. At all times during the License Term, Licensee shall maintain the Licensed Space, and all fixtures, equipment, machinery and other personal property located thereon and therein in good repair and in a clean, neat, orderly, healthy and safe condition, as determined by Village in its sole discretion.
- C. Licensee shall be responsible for the proper disposal of all trash and garbage in containers provided by the Village for Licensee's use in the garbage storage areas of the Licensed Space. Licensee shall be responsible for the sanitation of such containers. The Village shall provide for hauling the trash and garbage from the Licensed Space.
- D. Licensee shall permit inspection of the Licensed Space by authorized representatives of state, county or local departments of public health or any other agency exercising similar jurisdiction, and shall promptly and fully comply with any recommendations or requirements of same; and shall be solely responsible for any fines or citations issued in connection therewith.
- E. Licensee shall not make or permit any repairs, alterations, or installations to the Licensed Space without prior written permission from the Village. Any equipment installation by Licensee shall be in accordance with applicable building codes, health ordinances, and any conditions imposed by the Village. Any remodeling or repairs required as a result of the installation or removal of any equipment shall be completed only with the Village's prior written consent and at Licensee's sole cost and expense to the satisfaction of the Village. All improvements, fixtures and personal property located in, on or affixed to the Licensed Space prior to Licensee's first entrance therein, are and shall remain the property of the Village.

Alterations, improvements and fixtures made or installed by Licensee shall become the property of the Village at the end of the Term, unless the Village requires Licensee to remove same. Licensee shall be responsible for and shall pay to the Village promptly upon demand, the full cost of any restoration or repair to the Licensed Space which results from the removal of such alterations, improvements and/or fixtures.

- F. Licensee shall be responsible for all damage caused by License and its employees, agents, members, volunteers or invitees to any of Village's improvements, furniture, fixtures, equipment, and personal property located in or about the Licensed Space, ordinary wear and tear excepted. Licensee shall also be responsible for any and all damage done to all or any part of the Licensed Space or the Property by Licensee and its employees, agents, members, volunteers and invitees, and Licensee shall promptly reimburse Village for the full cost or repair of all such damages or replacement. Licensee shall return the Licensed Space fixtures and equipment to Village at the termination of the Agreement in as good a condition as it received same, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- G. The Licensed Space is provided on an "as is" "where is" basis. The Village shall not provide Licensee with any equipment, materials, or supplies of any nature whatsoever in connection with the Licensed Activities. Licensee shall supply all necessary equipment, materials, and supplies.
- 8. <u>Maintenance</u>. Except for damage or misuse caused by Licensee or its employees, agents, members, volunteers or invitees or as otherwise provided in this Agreement, Village shall be responsible for maintaining the Licensed Space and its systems in good repair and for cleaning the Licensed Space as necessary for the use of the Licensed Space by persons other than Licensee and its employees, agents, members, volunteers or invitees. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied herein, if Village determines in a particular instance, in good faith, that due to budgetary or fiscal constraints it lacks sufficient funds to perform any major repair or replacement responsibility imposed on it hereunder, Village may determine not to perform such repair/replacement and, in such event, Licensee shall have the option to terminate the License by giving prior written notice thereof to Village and, except for obligations accrued prior to the date of such termination, all obligations of the Parties under this Agreement shall thereupon cease.
- 9. <u>Suspension of Use</u>. In the event of an emergency, safety issue, or Licensee's failure to maintain insurance, or any other condition that constitutes a substantial threat to the health or safety of, or poses an increased risk of liability to Village or its officials, officers, employees, agents, invitees or others, as determined by Village in its sole reasonable discretion, Village may immediately suspend the License granted hereunder until such condition has been remedied to Village's satisfaction in accordance with this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Waiver and Release of Liability</u>. Licensee shall conduct its Licensed Activities entirely at its own risk. Licensee acknowledges that Village shall not provide any supervision, security or protection in connection with the Licensed Activities. Village shall not be liable or responsible for damage caused by fire, vandalism or other casualty to, or for the destruction,

loss, or theft of, any vehicle, equipment, material, supply or other personal property at any time during the Agreement. To the fullest extent permitted by the laws of the State of Illinois, Licensee hereby forever waives, relinquishes and discharges and holds harmless Village, and its officials, officers, employees and agents from, any and all claims of every nature whatsoever, which Licensee may have at any time against Village, its officials, officers, employees and/or agents, including without limitation claims for personal injury or property damage sustained or incurred by Licensee or any person claiming by, through or under Licensee, relating directly or indirectly to the Licensed Activities, the condition of the Licensed Space or Property, or use by Village or the Licensee of the Licensed Space or the Property.

- 11. <u>Insurance.</u> Licensee and any of its employees, agents, members, or volunteers shall procure and maintain the types and amounts of insurance, including but not limited to commercial general liability insurance, property damage, and worker's compensation insurance, as Village shall require in its sole discretion. Prior to commencement of the Licensed Activities, Licensee shall obtain and deliver to Village a certificate of insurance naming Village as an additional insured.
- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Licensee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless Village, its officers, officials, employees, agents, and volunteers and their successors and assigns, from and against any and all claims or demands of any nature whatsoever, including without limitation claims or demands for loss of, or damage to, property or for injury or death to any person from any cause whatsoever directly or indirectly arising from, related to, or connected with Licensee's use of the Licensed Space, or the conduct by Licensee of its Licensed Activities on the Property and/or Licensed Space, or the grant of License hereunder. Licensee shall pay all costs and expenses, including without limitation court costs and attorneys' fees, which shall be incurred by or imposed on Village either in enforcing the terms of this License or in any litigation or other proceeding to which Village may be made a party relating to the License or Licensee's use of the Property. Nothing herein provided is intended to waive nor shall it waive any of the immunities afforded Village under the "Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act" and Village shall continue to have all of the protections and immunities provided by said Act as now or hereafter amended.
- 13. <u>Termination</u>. The License and this Agreement may be terminated prior to their expiration under any of the following circumstances:
- A. Village shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and the non-exclusive License granted hereunder immediately and without notice upon Licensee's default of its obligations hereunder, or its violation of any federal or state laws, or local regulations or ordinances. Upon the effective date of termination, the respective rights and obligations of the Parties shall cease with the exception of any obligation that accrued prior to the effective date that remains unsatisfied on the effective date, including but not limited to any obligation under Paragraphs 10, 11 and 12 above.
- B. In the event Village discontinues the operation of or use of the Property or the Licensed Space for any reason whatsoever, the License shall automatically terminate. In the

event the Village suspends the operation of the Property or the Licensed Space for any reason, the License shall automatically be suspended for the same period and Licensee's obligation to pay the License Fee shall abate until such time as the Property or Licensed Space resumes operation.

C. The Village may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon fifteen (15) days advance written notice to Licensee.

In the event of termination under this Paragraph 13, all rights of Licensee and obligations of the Village shall cease. Village's right to collect sums due from Licensee under this Agreement and remedies for breach of the Agreement and Licensee's obligations to make such payments and compensate the Village for such breach shall continue after termination of this Agreement.

- 14. <u>No Liability</u>. The Village is not responsible or liable for any injury, damages or costs sustained or incurred by Licensee or to Licensee's person or property or sustained or incurred by any other person to his person or property while in or about the Licensed Space or otherwise related directly or indirectly to the License granted hereunder. Village is not liable for acts or omissions of Licensee, or any of its employees, members, agents, volunteers or other persons acting or purporting to act on behalf, at the request, or with the implied or actual consent of Licensee.
- 15. Compliance with Laws. Licensee shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county and local statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations and codes in the conduct of Licensed Activities, including but not limited to the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act (430 ILCS 65/0.01 et sea.) and the Firearm Concealed Carry Act (430 ILCS 66/1 et sea.). Licensee shall conduct, and cause its employees, agents, members, volunteers or invitees to conduct, the Licensed Activities in a safe manner and in strict accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Licensee shall not make or permit to be made any use of the Property or the Licensed Space which is directly or indirectly forbidden by law, ordinance, rule or regulation, or which may be dangerous to life, limb or property, or which may increase Village's insurable or uninsurable risk or liability. Licensee shall cooperate with Village and the Village's Police Department, and shall strictly follow all public safety requirements regarding its conduct of the Licensed Activities. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, Licensee and any of its employees, agents, members, volunteers or invitees shall comply with and adhere to the general procedures, rules and regulations of Village governing application for, and license or use of, a Licensed Space. Licensee shall comply with all other applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in the conduct of the Licensed Activities and its use of the Property and the Licensed Space. Village reserves the right to revise its current rules and regulations pertaining to the License or use of the Licensed Space and to promulgate such other and additional rules and regulations as in its reasonable judgment may from time to time be needed for the safety, care, cleanliness and reputation of the Property, including without limitation the Licensed Space, and for the preservation of good order therein and to ensure that its use is in conformity with all applicable laws. Provided, however, that Licensee may terminate this License

Agreement upon five (5) days prior written notice, if in the reasonable opinion of Licensee any of the rules and regulations singularly or together, effectively deny Licensee continued use of the Licensed Space as contemplated by this License and, in such event, Licensee shall be responsible only for such payments and the performance of such other obligations as shall have accrued prior to the date of termination. All rules and regulations shall be binding upon the Parties with the same force and effect as if they had been inserted herein at the time of the execution of this License Agreement.

- 16. No Property Interest. This Agreement and the License granted hereunder do not convey to, or create in favor of, Licensee, any legal or equitable title or property interest in whole or in part to the Licensed Space; it being acknowledged that this Agreement is a license and not a lease and merely grants temporary and limited permission to Licensee to use the Licensed Space on and subject to the terms and conditions hereof. Licensee expressly acknowledges and agrees that any statute or ordinance relating to landlord/tenant matters or forcible entry and detainer is not applicable to this Agreement and Licensee expressly waives any and all rights to which Licensee might otherwise be entitled under said laws.
- 17. <u>Written Notices</u>. All notices, requests, demands, payments, or other communications with respect to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given upon personal delivery or, if mailed, seventy-two (72) hours after deposit in the United States mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, with proper postage prepaid and addressed as follows (or to such other persons or addressees as may be designated by notice given to the other Party in accordance with this Paragraph 17).

This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes any and all previous communications and understandings, oral or written, between the Parties. This Agreement cannot be modified or amended unless in writing signed by both Parties and dated a date subsequent to the date of this Agreement.
- B. The headings of the paragraphs of this Agreement are for convenience and reference only, do not form any part of the Agreement, and in no way modify, interpret or construe the meaning of any provision of this Agreement, or the intent of the Parties.
- C. Nothing contained in this Agreement is intended, or shall be interpreted or construed, as creating any partnership or joint venture between the Parties, or as either expressly or implicitly providing any right, privilege or benefit of any kind whatsoever to any person or entity that is not a Party to this Agreement, or as acknowledging, establishing or imposing any legal duty or obligation on the part of either Party to any third party.
- D. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the Parties and their respective successors and assigns; provided however that neither this Agreement nor any right, interest or obligation of Licensee under this Agreement may be assigned in whole or in part by Licensee to any third party without the prior written consent of the Village, which the Village may grant or withhold in its sole discretion.
- E. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. The Parties agree that, for the purpose of any litigation relative to this Agreement and its enforcement, venue shall be in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois and the Parties consent to the *in personam* jurisdiction of said Court for any such action or proceeding.
- F. Nothing contained in or implied from any provision of this Agreement, including but not limited to Paragraphs 10, 11 and 12, is intended to constitute or shall constitute a waiver of the rights, defenses and immunities provided or available to Village under applicable Illinois law, including but not limited to the Illinois Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act.

In order to provide more flexibility for employees to use their deferred comp savings for needs that might arise prior to retirement, the Village would like to allow employees to request a loan from their 457 (b) accounts.

Guidelines have been put in place to protect the Village against loss in the event of a default. Employees must complete and sign payback schedules in order to receive the money. This benefit can be provided to employees at no cost to the Village.

BACKGROUND/HISTORY

Interest rates on General Obligation Bonds continue to be favorable. Over the past several years the Village has taken advantage of the favorable rates by advanced refunding and/or calling bonds with a net present value savings.

The Village's General Obligation Bonds Series 2005 have a current Net Interest Cost of 4.32% and are callable September 1, 2014. The net savings to call these bonds is estimated at \$55,479. The Village's Alternate Revenue Bonds Series 2012B has a net interest cost of 4.23%; however, the principal payments do not match with the Gateway TIF structure. The estimated cost to restructure the bonds is \$51,344. Staff's recommendation would be to call the General Obligation Bonds Series 2005 and restructure the Alternative Revenue Bonds Series 2012B for a total net savings of \$4,135.

The attached ordinance begins the process of calling and restructuring the bonds. The next steps according to the timetable would be to hold a public hearing on June 23, 2104.

RECOMMENDATION

PREAMBLES

WHEREAS, the Village of Lemont, Cook, DuPage and Will Counties, Illinois (the "Municipality"), operates in accordance with the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code [Section 5/1-1-1 et seq. of Chapter 65 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, as supplemented and amended, including by the Local Government Debt Reform Act (collectively, the "Act")] and is entitled to receive a certain distributive revenue share of proceeds of the (i) Retailers' Occupation Taxes, Service Occupation Taxes, Use Taxes and Service Use Taxes (collectively, and subject to any prior lien or pledge, "General Sales Taxes") imposed, collected and distributed pursuant to applicable law and of (ii) State of Illinois income taxes (such distributive share referred to herein as the "Revenue Sharing Receipts") imposed by the State of Illinois pursuant to the Illinois Income Tax Act and distributed pursuant to the State Revenue Sharing Act, and also is entitled to receive incremental taxes derived from the Municipality's Gateway Redevelopment Project Area (subject to any prior pledge, "Incremental Taxes"); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities") has determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the Municipality's public health, safety and welfare to refinance land assembly, site preparation, including remediation, demolition, environmental studies and related work, professional and other redevelopment project costs, within or serving the Gateway Redevelopment Project Area, capitalized interest, and related facilities, improvements and costs (collectively, the "Project") as originally financed by the Municipality's Taxable General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2012B (the "Prior Bonds") by reducing certain debt service payments and to concurrently refund at a lower interest cost the Municipality's General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2005; and

WHEREAS, the estimated Municipality's costs of refinancing and restructuring the Prior Bonds debt service, including necessary legal, financial, bond discount, printing and publication costs and other expenses preliminary to and in connection with the Project is anticipated not to exceed the sum of \$1,030,000, which is to be paid from proceeds of the hereinafter described alternate bonds, being general obligation bonds as authorized by Section 15 of the Local Government Debt Reform Act, but nevertheless expected to be paid from receipts of one or more of Incremental Taxes, General Sales Taxes and Revenue Sharing Receipts, rather than by any levy of taxes; and

WHEREAS, costs of the Project are expected to be paid from available funds

therefor and from proceeds from the sale of alternate Bonds, to be payable from one or more of General Sales Taxes, Revenue Sharing Receipts and Incremental Taxes and issued pursuant to the Act, this ordinance and one or more ordinances supplemental to this ordinance authorizing and providing for the issuance of such alternate Bonds, prescribing the details of such alternate Bonds and providing for the collection, segregation and distribution of Incremental Taxes, General Sales Taxes and Revenue Sharing Receipts derived by the Municipality in lieu of any levy of general taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has insufficient funds to pay costs of the Project and, therefore, must borrow money and issue alternate Bonds in evidence thereof, at one time or from time to time and in one or more series, up to the aggregate principal amount of \$4,750,000 for such purposes, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEMONT, COOK, DUPAGE AND WILL COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles and Determination to Issue Bonds. The Corporate Authorities hereby find that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this ordinance are true, complete and correct and hereby incorporate them into this Section 1 of this ordinance by this reference thereto. It is necessary and in the best interests of the Municipality to undertake the Project for the public health, safety and welfare, and that for the purpose of refinancing the Project by refunding certain of the Prior Bonds there are hereby authorized to be issued and sold, at one time or from time to time as the refunding may proceed, general obligation bonds (Incremental Taxes and/or General Sales Taxes and/or Revenue Sharing Receipts alternate revenue source(s)) of the Municipality in an aggregate principal amount up to but in any event not to exceed \$1,030,000 (which may be issued at one time or from time to time as funds are applied, the "Bonds"). The alternate revenue source(s) to pay debt service on the Bonds are receipts of one or more of Incremental Taxes, General Sales Taxes and Revenue Sharing Receipts.

Section 2. Publication and Notice. After the adoption of this ordinance by the Corporate Authorities, this ordinance, preceded by the notice hereinafter described, shall be published in a newspaper (as described in the Notice by Publication Act) published in Cook, DuPage and Will Counties, Illinois, and of general circulation within the Municipality, and if no petition, signed by not less than the number of electors of the Municipality being equal to the greater of (i) 7.5% of the registered voters within the Municipality or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less, asking that the Project be undertaken and of issuing the alternate Bonds to pay the costs of the Project be submitted to the electors of the Municipality, is filed with the Village Clerk within thirty (30) days after the date of the publication of this ordinance, preceded by a notice conforming with the provisions of the Local Government Debt Reform Act, then this ordinance shall be in full force and effect and the Bonds shall be authorized to be issued. If such a petition is filed, an election on the question shall be held as set forth in a form of notice complying with Section 15 of the Local Government Debt Reform Act and not inconsistent with this ordinance, and this ordinance shall not become effective until such question shall have been duly approved by a majority of the votes cast on the

question at the election held as set forth in such form of notice. The Village Clerk shall have available and provide a form of petition to any person requesting one. The Village Clerk shall give notice of the foregoing provisions as set forth in substantially the form of such notice as is presented before the meeting of the Corporate Authorities at which this ordinance is adopted, subject to completion and modification to conform with the Local Government Debt Reform Act.

Section 3. Additional Ordinances. If no petition meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed as provided above in Section 2, or if the question is approved as above set forth, then the Corporate Authorities in accordance with and pursuant to the Act may adopt additional ordinances or other proceedings supplemental to or amending this ordinance, at one time or from time to time as the refinancing and restructuring may proceed, providing for the issuance and sale of up to but in any event not to exceed the amount of the alternate Bonds set forth above, prescribing the details of such alternate Bonds, and providing for a levy of taxes and the collection, segregation and distribution of one or more of Incremental Taxes, General Sales Taxes and Revenue Sharing Receipts for the payment of the alternate Bonds issued. Such additional or supplemental ordinances or other proceedings shall in all instances become effective in accordance with applicable law; and this ordinance, together with such supplemental and additional ordinances or other proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for the issuance of the alternate Bonds under applicable law.

<u>Section</u> <u>4.</u> <u>Severability and Repealer</u>. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this ordinance. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

AN ACT concerning government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Open Meetings Act is amended by changing Section 2.02 as follows:

(5 ILCS 120/2.02) (from Ch. 102, par. 42.02)

Sec. 2.02. Public notice of all meetings, whether open or closed to the public, shall be given as follows:

(a) Every public body shall give public notice of the schedule of regular meetings at the beginning of each calendar or fiscal year and shall state the regular dates, times, and places of such meetings. An agenda for each regular meeting shall be posted at the principal office of the public body and at the location where the meeting is to be held at least 48 hours in advance of the holding of the meeting. A public body that has a website that the full-time staff of the public body maintains shall also post on its website the agenda of any regular meetings of the governing body of that public body. Any agenda of a regular meeting that is posted on a public body's website shall remain posted on the website until the regular meeting is concluded. The requirement of a regular meeting agenda shall not preclude the consideration of items not specifically set forth in the agenda. Public notice of any

special meeting except a meeting held in the event of a bona fide emergency, or of any rescheduled regular meeting, or of any reconvened meeting, shall be given at least 48 hours before such meeting, which notice shall also include the agenda for the special, rescheduled, or reconvened meeting, but the validity of any action taken by the public body which is germane to a subject on the agenda shall not be affected by other errors or omissions in the agenda. The requirement of public notice of reconvened meetings does not apply to any case where the meeting was open to the public and (1) it is to be reconvened within 24 hours, or (2) an announcement of the time and place of the reconvened meeting was made at the original meeting and there is no change in the agenda. Notice of an emergency meeting shall be given as soon as practicable, but in any event prior to the holding of such meeting, to any news medium which has filed an annual request for notice under subsection (b) of this Section.

(b) Public notice shall be given by posting a copy of the notice at the principal office of the body holding the meeting or, if no such office exists, at the building in which the meeting is to be held. In addition, a public body that has a website that the full-time staff of the public body maintains shall post notice on its website of all meetings of the governing body of the public body. Any notice of an annual schedule of meetings shall remain on the website until a new public notice of the schedule of regular meetings is approved.

Any notice of a regular meeting that is posted on a public body's website shall remain posted on the website until the regular meeting is concluded. The body shall supply copies of the notice of its regular meetings, and of the notice of any special, emergency, rescheduled or reconvened meeting, to any news medium that has filed an annual request for such notice. Any such news medium shall also be given the same notice of all special, emergency, rescheduled or reconvened meetings in the same manner as is given to members of the body provided such news medium has given the public body an address or telephone number within the territorial jurisdiction of the public body at which such notice may be given. The failure of a public body to post on its website notice of any meeting or the agenda of any meeting shall not invalidate any meeting or any actions taken at a meeting.

(c) Any agenda required under this Section shall set forth the general subject matter of any resolution or ordinance that will be the subject of final action at the meeting. The public body conducting a public meeting shall ensure that at least one copy of any requested notice and agenda for the meeting is continuously available for public review during the entire 48-hour period preceding the meeting. Posting of the notice and agenda on a website that is maintained by the public body satisfies the requirement for continuous posting under this subsection (c). If a notice or agenda is not continuously available for the full 48-hour period due to actions outside of

When Pollyanna Brewing was considering Lemont as the site for its brewery, the business and the Village engaged in incentive negotiations, during which the Village offered a matching grant not to exceed \$25,000 for certain necessary site improvements. Jerry Kulhanek, owner of the subject property, has submitted a grant application for this work, with a total grant amount of \$23,723.50. Because the property is within the Downtown TIF District, TIF funds are being used for the grant. It is not, however, a traditional TIF façade grant therefore the ordinance designates the grant as an economic development grant.

WHEREAS, the Village of Lemont ("Village") is an Illinois Municipal Corporation pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Statutes of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section 5/8-1-2.5 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-1-2.5) provides municipalities with the authority to appropriate and expend funds for economic development purposes, including but not limited to grants that are deemed desirable for the promotion of economic development within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Village is desirous to promote the growth and development of certain designated commercial rehabilitation areas of the Village known as the Tax Increment Financing District; and

WHEREAS, Jerry Kulhanek, acting on behalf of 507 Talcott, LLC, owner of the subject property, has requested and applied for a grant to fund certain improvements to the property known as 431 Talcott Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Village is committed to quality economic development projects which will serve to improve the economic base in the community leading to increased business activity, development of job opportunities, enhanced equalized assessed value of property within the Village, enhanced revenue which will contribute to the cost of public services, all of which will serve to improve the health, safety, and general welfare of the businesses and residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees hereby finds that the described improvements will generally improve the previously vacant property and enable it to be occupied by a microbrewery, the operation of which is anticipated to have a positive local economic impact; and

WHEREAS, this grant is administered by the Village and is funded from District Revenues for purposes of control and prevention of blight, dilapidation and deterioration of designated areas within the District, and

WHEREAS, the Village has agreed to participate, subject to its sole discretion, in sharing the costs of downtown building, sign, and site improvements to commercial establishments within the District; and

WHEREAS, the property is located within the Tax Increment Financing District/Downtown, a designated rehabilitation area, and the owner has requested and applied for a grant pursuant to the terms and provisions of this agreement.

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees has recommended a maximum grant amount of \$23,723.50.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF

TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEMONT, COUNTIES OF COOK, DUPAGE, AND WILL, ILLINOIS:

- **Section 1:** The statements set forth in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into this Ordinance as if set forth in full.
- **Section 2:** That the President be and is hereby authorized and directed, and the Village Clerk is directed to attest to the document known as "Downtown Lemont Economic Development Grant Agreement" for 431 Talcott Avenue, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof.
- **Section 3:** That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement"), entered into this 12th day of May, 2014, between the Village of Lemont, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as the "VILLAGE") and the following designated OWNER/LESSEE, to wit:

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Section 5/8-1-2.5 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-1-2.5) provides municipalities with the authority to appropriate and expend funds for economic development purposes, including but not limited to grants that are deemed desirable for the promotion of economic development within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Village is committed to quality economic development projects which will serve to improve the economic base in the community leading to increased business activity, development of job opportunities, enhanced equalized assessed value of property within the Village, enhanced revenue which will contribute to the cost of public services, all of which will serve to improve the health, safety, and general welfare of the businesses and residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees hereby finds that the described improvements will generally improve the previously vacant property and enable it to be occupied by a microbrewery, the operation of which is anticipated to have a positive local economic impact; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE is desirous to promote the growth and development of certain designated commercial rehabilitation areas of the VILLAGE known as the Tax Increment Financing District; and

WHEREAS, this grant is administered by the VILLAGE and is funded from District Revenues for purposes of control and prevention of blight, dilapidation and deterioration of designated areas within the District, and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE has agreed to participate, subject to its sole discretion, in sharing the costs of downtown building, sign, and site improvements to commercial establishments within the District; and

- **WHEREAS,** the OWNER's/LESSEE's property is located within the Tax Increment Financing District/Downtown, a designated rehabilitation area, and the OWNER/LESSEE has requested and applied for a grant pursuant to the terms and provisions of this agreement.
- **NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreement obtained herein, the VILLAGE and OWNER/LESSEE do hereby agree as follows:
- <u>Section 1.</u> COST SHARING. The VILLAGE shall reimburse the OWNER/LESSEE for fifty percent of the costs for property improvements as described in Exhibit A to the OWNER's/LESSEE's property, and as reviewed and approved for a Certificate of Appropriateness by the Lemont Historic Preservation Commission. The maximum amount of reimbursement for said property improvements shall not exceed \$23,723.50.
- <u>Section 2.</u> PLAN APPROVAL. No building, sign, or site improvement shall be undertaken until the building, sign, and/or site plans have been submitted to and approved by the VILLAGE. Following approval, the OWNER/LESSEE shall cause all such improvements to be completed within 180 days of the date of the approval of this Agreement.
- Section 3. REVIEW OF PROJECT. The Planning & Economic Development Director shall periodically review the progress of the contractor's work on the building, sign, and site improvements pursuant to this Agreement. Such inspections shall not replace any required permit inspection by Village Inspectors. All work which is not in conformance with the approved drawings and specifications shall be immediately remedied by the OWNER/LESSEE and deficient or improper work shall be replaced and made to comply with the approved drawings, specifications, and terms of this Agreement.
- <u>Section 4.</u> DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS. Upon completion of the building and site improvement/historic preservation and upon its final inspection and approval by the Building Department, the OWNER/LESSEE shall submit to the VILLAGE a properly executed and notarized contractor statement and architect fee statement showing the full cost of the work as well as each separate component amount due to the contractor and each and every subcontractor involved in furnishing labor, materials, or equipment in the work.

In addition, the OWNER/LESSEE shall submit to the VILLAGE proof of payment of the contract cost pursuant to the contractor's and architect's statements. The VILLAGE shall, within sixty days of receipt of the contractor's statement and proof of payment issue a check to the OWNER/LESSEE. In no case shall the amount paid to the OWNER/LESSEE exceed the amount specified in this Agreement or in the contractor's or architect's statements. At the time of reimbursement and throughout the term of this agreement, the land use and signage under the control of the OWNER/LESSEE shall be in conformance with zoning and sign code provisions.

- <u>Section 5.</u> FAILURE TO COMPLETE WORK. If the OWNER/LESSEE or his contractor fails to complete the building, sign, or site improvements in conformity with the plans provided for in Exhibit A and in conformity with the provisions of this Agreement, this Agreement shall terminate and the financial obligation on the part of the VILLAGE shall cease and become null and void.
 - Section 6. UNRELATED IMPROVEMENTS. Nothing herein is intended to limit,

restrict or prohibit the OWNER/LESSEE from undertaking any other work in or about the subject premises which is unrelated to the building, sign, and site improvement provided for in this Agreement.

<u>Section 7.</u> VILLAGE INDEMNIFICATION REGARDING CONSTRUCTION. The OWNER/LESSEE of the Subject Property agree to defend and hold harmless the Village from any and all claims which may arise out of this grant and the construction activities under this Agreement.

Section 8. GENERAL INDEMNIFICATION. In the event that, as a result of this Agreement, or actions taken as required hereunder, the VILLAGE is made a party defendant in any litigation arising by reason of this Agreement, and development activities contemplated hereunder, the OWNER/LESSEE agree to defend and hold harmless the VILLAGE, the mayor, trustees, officers and agents thereof, individually and collectively, from any suits and from any claims, demands, setoff or other action including but not limited to judgments arising therefrom. The OWNER/LESSEE shall have the right to appeal to courts of appellate jurisdiction any judgment taken against the VILLAGE or its officers or agents in this respect, and the Village shall join in any such appeal taken by the OWNER/LESSEE.

Section 9. PERFORMANCE OF AGREEMENT. It is agreed that the parties hereto may in law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus, or any other proceeding, including specific performance, enforce or compel the performance of this Agreement, which shall include the right of the parties to recover a judgment for monetary damages against each other, provided, however, that the OWNER/LESSEE shall not have a right to recover a judgment for monetary damages against any elected or appointed official of the VILLAGE for any breach of any of the terms of this Agreement. The VILLAGE reserves the right to maintain an action to recover damages or any sums which OWNER/LESSEE have agreed to pay pursuant to this Agreement and which have become due and remained unpaid.

Section 10. EXHIBITS. It is agreed that Exhibit A shall be considered part of this agreement.

<u>Section 11.</u> DISPLAY OF VILLAGE FUNDING PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL. The OWNER/LESSEE hereby agrees to prominently display a poster identifying the property as receiving VILLAGE funding under a grant. The sign will be provided by the VILLAGE and shall be displayed upon approval of this Agreement to no less than thirty days after final approval and reimbursement is made.


