Garbage Pick-Up

Refuse Service: Garbage cans are issued by Waste Management. All items must be placed at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection. ONE (1) large household item such as discarded furniture, mattresses, etc. will be collected on the regular pick-up day. Carpeting/padding should be cut and rolled in 4 foot lengths weighing no more than 50 pounds each. Additional oversized items may require a special pick-up. Please contact Waste Management for an estimate. Waste Management will bill residents directly for service on a quarterly basis. A \$1.00 senior discount will apply to all qualified senior citizens that are at least 65 years old and that own and occupy their own dwelling.

Recycling: Recycling is collected weekly on the same day as garbage pick-up. Newspapers, mixed paper products, glass jars and bottles, aluminum/metal cans and plastic food grade containers are accepted. Polystyrene (carry-out containers) are no longer accepted. Bottles that contained motor oil, pesticides, or chemicals will NOT be accepted. Replacement or additional recycling bins may be purchased by calling the Customer Service Department of Waste Management.

<u>Yard Waste</u>: Yard waste such as grass clippings and leaves should be placed in Kraft-type biodegradable paper bags. <u>Cans cannot be used</u>. Residents with large yard waste needs may rent a 96-gallon yard waste cart for the season which holds the equivalent of three 30-gallon Kraft bags.

<u>Branches/Leaves</u>: Brush must be cut into 4 foot sections and bundled. Branches may not exceed 4 ft. in length or 4 inches in diameter. They must be tied with biodegradable string or twine in bundles not to exceed 50 pounds. These items will be picked up on the regular pick-up day from April 1 through November 30.

White Goods/Tires/Hazardous Waste: Household appliances, air conditioners, heat pumps, water heaters, furnaces and boilers have been banned from landfills. Automotive tires have also been banned. To dispose of these items, please contact a local appliance business for recycling or collection information. Toxic products such as automotive batteries, oil base paints, insectisides, oil, antifreeze, etc. cannot be collected through your residential pick-up. The Village provides a semi-annual Motor Oil Recycling Event in April & October to dispose of used motor oil/fuel/lubricant oil and antifreeze. Did You Know?

Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers are required for all licensed vehicles registered in Lemont.

New residents and owners of new vehicles must purchase stickers within 30 days. Price DOUBLES thereafter. Purchase stickers at:

Village Hall: (630) 257-1550 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Mon. - Fri.

Police Department: (630) 257-2229 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Mon. - Fri.

Vehicle stickers are sold on a two-year basis beginning June 1st and must be displayed by July 31st. Senior discounts are available at age 65 for auto or B truck plates.

Animal License Regulations

Animals may not roam freely, unless in a fenced area. Pets being walked on the public way must be on a leash. Excrement must be immediately picked up. Animals found running at large will be impounded and a citation issued to the owner. For any impounded or lost animals, call non-emergency police at (630) 257-2229.

Pets are prohibited, except for guide dogs, at or upon any school premise, public playground, public swimming pool, festival or special event, unless official written permission has been granted by the public agency owning the property.

Tornado Siren Policy

During a severe weather incident, the tornado siren will only be activated if a tornado or funnel cloud aloft is reported within a ten-mile radius based from the center of Lemont. The borders of the ten-mile radius are Route 59 to the west, I-80 to the south, Ogden Avenue to the north and Harlem Avenue to the east.

The tornado siren will also be activated any time the National Weather Service advises a tornado warning which addresses the Village or Township and when wind gusts are clocked in excess of 50 m.p.h. NO ALL CLEAR SIREN WILL BE ACTIVATED. Once activated, the sirens will <u>not</u> be re-activated for one hour <u>unless</u> a rotating wall cloud, funnel cloud aloft, or tornado has been sighted and is a clear and present danger to the Village or Township.

Emergency sirens are tested the first Tuesday of each month at 10:00 a.m. by the Lemont Fire Protection District.

Did You Know?

Lawn Sprinkling Regulations

Between May 15th and October 1st, lawn sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 a.m. Properties with odd-numbered postal addresses may water on odd-numbered calender days; even-numbered postal addresses may water on even-numbered calender days.

Block Parties

Any resident wishing to hold a block party should first apply to the Police Department before making arrangements. A permit is required.

Garage Sale, Real Estate and Political Signs

Signs must be posted on Private Property. Signs are not allowed on Village property such as parkways, trees, utility poles etc., and must not exceed six square feet in area. All signs must be removed promptly after the event is complete. Permits for garage sales are not required.

Open Burning

Bonfires/ burning of leaves and rubbish is prohibited in the Village of Lemont due to the public health concerns associated with this activity.

BB Guns/Firearms

It is unlawful to discharge BB Guns/Firearms within the Village of Lemont.

South Suburban Mayors and Managers' Home Single Family Residential Rehabilitation Program (SFR)

Home rehabilitation funds are available with zero interest and no repayment until you sell or transfer title to your home. The Single Family Rehabilitation Program corrects all code violations, including plumbing, electrical, roof replacement, siding, window replacement, furnace replacement, etc. For more information and to determine income guidelines, please call the Village of Lemont's Single Family Rehabilitation Administrator, Charles Echols, at SSMMA Home SFR Program, 1904 W. 174th Street, East Hazel Crest, Illinois 60429, (708) 922-4600.

Spring and Fall Recycling Special Events:

The Lemont Environmental Advisory Commission (630-257-6052) holds semiannual Recycling Days (April & October) in the METRA parking lot. Residents may drop off used motor/fuel/lubricant oil, brake/transmission fluid and antifreeze, along with electronics recycling, document disposal, latex paint recycling, and much more. Watch for information on these special events.

Public Works Department

The Public Works Department is assigned the responsibility of maintenance of public streets; public buildings; street lighting; traffic signals and parking lots; and maintenance of the water and sewer system. To report concerns about street maintenance, sewer problems, water main leaks or storm damage, please call the Public Works Department at (630) 257-2532.

Water Billing Department

Please call the Water Billing Department (630-257-6277) for billing information, meter readings, and final readings Monday thru Friday, 7:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Homeowners age 65 or older who are living in the residence are eligible to receive a 50% discount on the minimum charge on their water bill. Payments may be mailed or paid in person at the Village Hall or the drop box after hours which is located in the lobby at 416 Main Street.

Police Department

The Lemont Police Department provides numerous services including: neighborhood and business district patrols, traffic enforcement, criminal investigations, records maintenance, parking control, a school crossing guard program, Lemont Police Cadet Program, crime prevention programs, and police counseling in schools.

<u>Citizen Police Academy</u>: This is a ten week program sponsored by the Police Department for Lemont residents. The program meets one evening each week from 7:00 p.m. - 10:00 p.m. Participants receive hands-on experience and training in police procedures.

<u>Child Safety Seat Instruction</u>: The Lemont Police Department has personnel certified for installing child safety seats in vehicles. To make an appointment call 630-257-2229.

<u>Neighborhood Watch Program</u> is available for Lemont residents. For information call (630) 257-2229.

<u>Vacation Watch</u>: If you will be out of town and would like a vacation watch kept on your home, a Vacation Watch application must be filled out at the Police Department and an officer will check your home in the morning and evening.

<u>Curfew:</u> Less than 13 years of age: 9:00 p.m.; Ages 13 but not yet 17: Sunday thru Thursday 11:00 p.m.; 12:00 midnight on Friday & Saturday.

Parking Regulations

- Parking across sidewalks is prohibited in the Village.
- Boats or RV's up to 32' in length may be parked in the side or rear yard buildable area, or fully concealed in the rear yard, not closer than 3 feet to a property line.
- Trucks/Commercial vehicles with "C" thru "Z" plates shall not be permitted to park or to be stored in a residential district, except when located in a garage, in a fully enclosed structure or in a manner as to substantially conceal it from the view of adjoining property owners if parked in the rear yard area. A limit of one (1) commercial vehicle with a "B" license plate shall be permitted to be parked on a residential lot.
- It is unlawful to park any vehicle upon any street for the purpose of displaying it for sale.
- Inoperable motor vehicles must be promptly removed, whether on public or private property.
- After a snowfall of two inches, park on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd calendar days and on the even numbered side of the street on even calendar days. The day is considered to begin at 9:00 a.m.
- No vehicle shall be parked with the left side of the vehicle or left wheel to curb, except on a one-way street.

Building Permits Required

Permits are required for new construction, remodeling, and grading changes. Permits are also required for fences, sheds, decks, pools, sprinkling systems, garages, patios, siding, etc. Various other improvements also require permits. The Building Department should be contacted prior to starting any work to inquire whether a permit is needed. Applications are available in the Building Department, 418 Main Street, Lemont, IL 60439.

A Certificate of Appropriateness is required, in addition to a Building Permit, for any exterior alteration, remodeling, new construction or demolition of residential structures within the Lemont Historic District.

Currently adopted Building Codes: 2006 International Building Code (Industrial, Commercial & Multi-Family), 2006 International Residential Code (One-Family and Two-Family Dwellings), 2006 International Property Maintenance Code, 2005 National Electrical Code (NFPA 70-2005) 2004 Illinois Plumbing Code, 2006 International Mechanical Code, 2006 International Fuel Gas Code, 2006 International Energy Conservation Code, 2006 International Fire Code (Industrial, Commercial & Multi-Family). Health inspections are performed by the Cook County Dept. of Public Health.

Weed Abatement Program

Current Village ordinance restricts the height of grasses and weeds to a maximum of 8 inches. When a property is identified, the Building Department Code Enforcement Officer will document the violation by photographing the property. Notification of violation is made by certified mail to the property owner, giving 7 days from receipt of notice to have the weeds or grass cut. If property owner does not comply, the Building Department will hire a contractor to have the property mowed and bill the property owner. You may reach the Village Code Enforcement Officer at (630) 243-2725.

Permitted Construction Hours

Contractors or residents are permitted to perform construction activities between Monday - Friday: Saturday & Sunday: the following hours: 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

8:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

If there are concerns or violations, please call the Building Dept. for enforcement.

Lawn Sprinker System Annual Certification Required

RPZ (Reduced Pressure Zone) valves must be tested/certified annually and a report submitted to the Building Department. The annual report is required in accordance with the Illinois EPA code regulations. The test/certification must be completed by a certified Cross Connection Control Device Inspector. The Building Dept. maintains a list of certified testers. Failure to submit the annual test report/certification may result in disconnection of the water service to your residence and/or issuance of citations.
