Motor Oil Recycling

Collecting used motor oil, fuel oil, lubricant oil, brake/transmission fluid and antifreeze. *CITGO Refinery*

Document Disposal

Dispose of personal papers safely and securely. All documents will be shredded on site. *Paper recycling will be limited to 100 lbs. per citizen. Business paper recycling will NOT* be accepted. Beaver Shredding

Electronics Recycling

Dispose of outdated electronic equipment including PCs and computer peripherals, servers, networking equipment, stereo & home entertainment equipment & phone equipment. Flat screen televisions and monitors will be accepted. *E-Tech Trading*

Prescription Medication Collection (Collection Area within the Metra Station)

Dispose of unused and outdated prescription medications safely while saving our water supply. **Needles, EPI pens, and liquids will NOT be accepted**. All pills must be removed from containers and placed in zip lock bag. **Lemont Police Department**

CFL and Fluorescent Light Bulb Collection

Accepting CFL and up to 4-foot fluorescent light bulbs. **CFL bulbs may <u>NOT</u>** be disposed of in the trash. Incandescent light bulbs can be disposed as general refuse and will <u>NOT</u> be accepted. **CITGO Refinery**

Battery Collection

Accepting rechargeable batteries (including NiCd, NiMH, Lithium Ion), button batteries (watches, hearing aids), and car batteries for proper disposal. *Alkaline batteries can be disposed as general refuse as they are no longer considered hazardous. Alkaline batteries will NOT be accepted.*CITGO Refinery

Glasses / Hearing Aids / Printer Inks / Cell Phones

Collection of eye glasses, hearing aids, printer inks, cell phones, and pull tabs from soda cans. *Lemont Lions Club*

Bicycle Recycling

Accepting used bicycles, bicycle parts and accessories. *Working Bikes Cooperative*

Food Collection for the Food Pantries (Collection Area within the Metra Station)

Bring non-perishable food for the Food Pantries to the Metra Station. Check expiration dates.

Household Goods

Dispose of gently used items in <u>good condition</u>, including clothing, shoes, hats/gloves, jewelry, books, records, dishes, glassware, kitchen utensils, décor, games, toys, sports equipment, and hand tools.

Goodwill Industries

*Furniture, Mattresses/Pillows, Large Exercise Equipment, Construction Materials, Tires, Carpet, CRT Televisions/Monitors, Appliances (including AC Units and Microwaves), Weapons, and Hazardous Materials will NOT be accepted. Also, Cribs, Car seats, Baby Walkers or other products that do not meet the current safety standards of the US Consumer Product Safety Commission, including recalled items.
